A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the integration of early voting by personal appearance
- 3 and election day voting, including the manner in which election
- 4 returns are processed and other related changes.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 12.004(d), Election Code, is amended to 7 read as follows:
- 8 (d) If early voting by personal appearance is required to be
- 9 conducted for extended hours under Section 85.005(c) [or for
- 10 weekend hours under Section 85.006(e)], the registrar's office
- 11 shall remain open for providing voter registration information
- 12 during the extended hours [or weekend hours] that the main early
- 13 voting polling place is open for voting.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 19.004(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- 16 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (d), state funds
- 17 disbursed under this chapter may be used only to:
- 18 (1) defray expenses of the registrar's office in
- 19 connection with voter registration, including additional expenses
- 20 related to:
- 21 (A) implementation of the National Voter
- 22 Registration Act of 1993 (52 U.S.C. Section 20501 et seq.);
- 23 (B) complying with weekly updating requirements;
- 24 and

- 1 (C) the employment of temporary voter 2 registration personnel for not more than 39 weeks in a state fiscal
- 3 year; and
- 4 (2) if the registrar's county has a population of less
- 5 than 55,000, defray the cost to the registrar's county of keeping
- 6 the polling places in the county open during the early voting period
- 7 as required under Section [Sections] 85.005(c)[, 85.006(e), and
- $8 \frac{85.064(d)}{1}$
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 42.0051, Election Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 42.0051. COMBINING CERTAIN PRECINCTS. (a) <u>if changes</u>
- 12 in county election precinct boundaries to give effect to a
- 13 redistricting plan result in county election precincts with fewer
- 14 than 3,000 registered voters, a commissioners court for a general
- 15 or special election, or for a primary election, the county
- 16 <u>executive committee of a political party conducting a primary</u>
- 17 <u>election</u>, may combine county election precincts notwithstanding
- 18 Section 42.005 to avoid unreasonable expenditures for election
- 19 equipment, supplies, and personnel [This section applies only to a
- 20 county with a population of less than 1.2 million that does not
- 21 participate in the countywide polling place program described by
- 22 Section 43.007].
- 23 (b) A combined precinct under Subsection (a) is subject to
- 24 the maximum population prescribed for a precinct under Section
- 25 42.006.
- (c) $[\frac{(a-1)}{a}]$ In a primary election, the county executive
- 27 committee of a political party conducting the primary election, or

- 1 for a general or special election for which use of county election
- 2 precincts is required, the commissioner's court of a county that
- 3 does not participate in the countywide polling place program
- 4 <u>described</u> by <u>Section 43.007</u> may, on the recommendation of the
- 5 county election board, combine county election precincts
- 6 notwithstanding Section 42.005 if:
- 7 (1) the commissioners court cannot secure a suitable
- 8 polling place location under Section 43.031; and
- 9 (2) the location of the combined polling place
- 10 adequately serves the voters of the combined precinct.
- 11 (d) [(c)] A combined precinct under <u>Subsection (c)</u> [this
- 12 section] may not contain more than 10,000 registered voters. If a
- 13 county has more than one combined precinct under Subsection (c),
- 14 the number of voters contained in the smallest combined precinct in
- 15 the county may not be less than 95 percent of the number of voters
- 16 contained in the largest combined precinct in the county.
- 17 <u>(e)</u> [(d)] A combined precinct may not be established if it:
- 18 (1) results in a dilution of voting strength of a group
- 19 covered by the federal Voting Rights Act (42 U.S.C. Section 1973c et
- 20 seq.);
- 21 (2) results in a dilution of representation of a group
- 22 covered by the Voting Rights Act in any political or electoral
- 23 process or procedure; or
- 24 (3) results in discouraging participation by a group
- 25 covered by the Voting Rights Act in any political or electoral
- 26 process or procedure because of the location of a polling place or
- 27 other factors.

- 1 (f) For the purposes of appointing a presiding election
- 2 judge and an alternate presiding judge to a county election
- 3 precinct combined under this section, the combined precinct shall
- 4 be considered a single precinct and the judges shall be appointed in
- 5 accordance with the procedures provided under Chapter 32.
- 6 SECTION 4. Subchapter A, Chapter 43, Election Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 43.0015 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 43.0015. DESIGNATION OF LOCATION: USE OF EARLY VOTING
- 9 POLLING PLACE ON ELECTION DAY. The authority responsible for
- 10 designating polling places under this subchapter shall, at a
- 11 minimum, designate as locations for polling places on election day:
- 12 (1) the location designated as the main early voting
- 13 polling place under Section 85.002;
- 14 (2) each location designated as a permanent branch
- 15 polling place under Section 85.061; and
- 16 (3) each location designated as a temporary branch
- 17 polling place under Section 85.062.
- SECTION 5. Section 61.002(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- 20 (a) Immediately before opening the polls for voting on the
- 21 first day of voting at a polling place during early voting or [and]
- 22 on election day, the presiding election judge or alternate election
- 23 judge shall confirm that each voting machine has any public counter
- 24 reset to zero and shall print the tape that shows the counter was
- 25 set to zero for each candidate or measure on the ballot.
- SECTION 6. Section 62.005, Election Code, is amended to
- 27 read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 62.005. EXAMINING BALLOT BOXES. On the first day of
- 2 voting at a polling place during early voting or on election day, an
- 3 [An] election officer shall open and examine the ballot boxes and
- 4 remove any contents from the boxes.
- 5 SECTION 7. Section 65.002(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (a) Subject to Subsection (b), the presiding judge may
- 8 direct the counting of ballots to occur on election day at any time
- 9 after the polls have been open for one hour.
- SECTION 8. Section 65.014(b), Election Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 (b) The returns must state:
- 13 (1) the total number of voters who voted at the polling
- 14 place during early voting by personal appearance and on election
- 15 day as indicated by the poll list; and
- 16 (2) the total number of votes counted for each
- 17 candidate and for and against each measure.
- SECTION 9. Sections 65.016(a) and (b), Election Code, are
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (a) A county that holds or provides election services for an
- 21 election and maintains an Internet website shall post on its public
- 22 Internet website for an election of public officials or of a
- 23 governmental entity authorized by law to impose a tax administered
- 24 by the county:
- 25 (1) the results of each election;
- 26 (2) the total number of votes cast;
- 27 (3) the total number of votes cast for each candidate

- 1 or for or against each measure;
- 2 (4) the total number of votes cast for each candidate
- 3 or for or against each measure at each polling location;
- 4 (5) the total number of votes cast by personal
- 5 appearance [on election day];
- (6) $[\frac{(5)}{}]$ the total number of votes cast by personal
- 7 appearance or mail [during the early voting period]; and
- 8 (7) [(6)] the total number of counted and uncounted
- 9 provisional ballots cast.
- 10 (b) A city or independent school district that holds an
- 11 election and maintains an Internet website shall post on its public
- 12 Internet website for the city or independent school district, as
- 13 applicable:
- 14 (1) the results of each election;
- 15 (2) the total number of votes cast;
- 16 (3) the total number of votes cast for each candidate
- 17 or for or against each measure;
- 18 (4) the total number of votes cast for each candidate
- 19 or for or against each measure at each polling location;
- 20 (5) the total number of votes cast by personal
- 21 appearance [on election day];
- 22 (6) [(5)] the total number of votes cast by personal
- 23 appearance or mail [during the early voting period]; and
- 24 (7) [(6)] the total number of counted and uncounted
- 25 provisional ballots cast.
- SECTION 10. The heading to Section 66.0021, Election Code,
- 27 is amended to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 66.0021. [ELECTION DAY] VOTE TOTAL FOR CERTAIN
- 2 ELECTIONS.
- 3 SECTION 11. Section 66.0021(b), Election Code, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 (b) The general custodian of election records for a primary
- 6 election or the general election for state and county officers
- 7 shall maintain a list that states the total number of votes cast in
- 8 each precinct by personal appearance [on election day] that is
- 9 available for public inspection not later than the day after
- 10 election day.
- SECTION 12. Sections 67.004(b) and (b-1), Election Code,
- 12 are amended to read as follows:
- 13 (b) The canvassing authority shall prepare a tabulation
- 14 stating for each candidate and for and against each measure:
- 15 (1) the total number of votes received in each
- 16 precinct; [and]
- 17 (2) the total number of votes received in each polling
- 18 location; and
- 19 (3) the sum of the precinct totals tabulated under
- 20 Subdivision (1).
- 21 (b-1) The tabulation in Subsection (b) must also include for
- 22 each precinct and for each polling location the total number of
- 23 voters who cast a ballot for a candidate or for or against a measure
- 24 in the election. The secretary of state shall prescribe any
- 25 procedures necessary to implement this subsection.
- SECTION 13. Section 67.017(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 27 read as follows:

- 1 (a) After each election for a statewide office or the office 2 of United States representative, state senator, or representative, a district office, a county office, or a precinct 3 4 office, the county clerk shall prepare a report of the number of votes, including [early voting] votes cast by mail and [early 5 voting votes cast] by personal appearance, received in each county 6 7 election precinct and in each polling location for each candidate for each of those offices. In a presidential election year, the 8 9 report must include the number of votes received in each precinct and in each polling location for each set of candidates for 10 president and vice-president of the United States. 11
- 13 read as follows:

SECTION 14. Section 84.032(c), Election Code, is amended to

- 14 (c) An applicant may submit a request [after the close of 15 early voting by personal appearance] by appearing in person and:
- 16 (1) returning the ballot to be voted by mail to the 17 early voting clerk; or
- 18 (2) executing an affidavit that the applicant:
- 19 (A) has not received the ballot to be voted by
- 20 mail;
- 21 (B) never requested a ballot to be voted by mail;
- 22 or

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- (C) received notice of a defect under Section
- 24 87.0271(b) or (c) or 87.0411(b) or (c).
- 25 SECTION 15. Sections 85.001(a) and (e), Election Code, are
- 26 amended to read as follows:
- 27 (a) The period for early voting by personal appearance

- 1 begins on the 12th [17th] day before election day, [and] continues
- 2 through the [fourth] day before election day, and includes
- 3 Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, except as otherwise provided by
- 4 this section.
- 5 (e) For an election held on the uniform election date in May
- 6 and any resulting runoff election, the period for early voting by
- 7 personal appearance begins on the ninth [12th] day before election
- 8 day, [and] continues through the [fourth] day before election day,
- 9 and includes Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays.
- SECTION 16. Sections 85.005(a), (b), and (c), Election
- 11 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c), in an election in
- 13 which a county clerk is the early voting clerk under Section 83.002,
- 14 early voting by personal appearance at the main early voting
- 15 polling place shall be conducted on each day [weekday] of the early
- 16 voting period [that is not a legal state holiday and] for a period
- 17 of at least nine hours, except that voting may not be conducted
- 18 earlier than 6 a.m. or later than 10 p.m.
- 19 (b) In an election to which Subsection (a) does not apply,
- 20 early voting by personal appearance at the main early voting
- 21 polling place shall be conducted at least nine hours each day
- 22 [weekday] of the early voting period [that is not a legal state
- 23 holiday] unless the territory covered by the election has fewer
- 24 than 1,000 registered voters. In that case, the voting shall be
- 25 conducted at least four hours each day. The authority ordering the
- 26 election, or the county clerk if that person is the early voting
- 27 clerk, shall determine which hours the voting is to be conducted.

- 1 (c) Voting in a primary election [or] the general election for state and county officers, or a special election ordered by the 2 governor shall be conducted at the main early voting polling place 3 4 for at least 12 consecutive hours on each [weekday] of the last four days [week] of the early voting period except that voting shall be 5 conducted for at least nine consecutive hours on a Sunday[, and the 6 7 voting in a special election ordered by the governor shall be conducted at the main early voting polling place for at least 12 8 9 consecutive hours on each of the last two days of the early voting period]. Voting under this subsection may not be conducted earlier 10 11 than 6 a.m. or later than 10 p.m.
- 12 SECTION 17. Sections 85.007(a) and (b), Election Code, are 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The election order and the election notice must state:
- 15 (1) the date that early voting will begin if under 16 Section 85.001(d) the early voting period is to begin later than the 17 prescribed date; and
- 18 (2) the regular dates and hours that voting will be
 19 conducted under Section 85.005(b), including[; and
- 20 [(3) the dates and hours that] voting on Saturday or 21 Sunday [is ordered to be conducted under Section 85.006(a)].
- (b) The early voting clerk shall post notice for each election stating the dates and hours that voting on a Saturday or Sunday will [is ordered to] be conducted [under Section 85.006(b)].
- SECTION 18. Section 85.032, Election Code, is amended by amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (g) to read as follows:

- 1 (d) Each custodian shall retain possession of the key
- 2 entrusted to the custodian until it is delivered to, as applicable,
- 3 the presiding judge of:
- 4 <u>(1)</u> the central counting station;
- 5 (2) the early voting ballot board; or
- 6 (3) an election day polling place.
- 7 (g) Voted early voting ballots to be counted manually shall
- 8 <u>be kept in a separate ballot box from voted early voting ballots to</u>
- 9 be counted using automatic tabulating equipment.
- 10 SECTION 19. Section 85.033, Election Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 85.033. SECURITY OF VOTING MACHINE. At the close of
- 13 early voting each day, the early voting clerk shall secure each
- 14 voting machine used for early voting in the manner prescribed by the
- 15 secretary of state so that its unauthorized operation is prevented.
- 16 The clerk shall unsecure the machine before the beginning of
- 17 [early] voting the following day.
- 18 SECTION 20. Section 85.071, Election Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- Sec. 85.071. DELIVERY OF BALLOTS TO MAIN POLLING PLACE. (a)
- 21 During the period for early voting by personal appearance, the
- 22 ballots voted at a branch polling place[, other than those cast on a
- 23 voting machine, shall be:
- 24 (1) retained securely at the branch polling place in a
- 25 locked room accessible only to election officers; or
- 26 (2) delivered by an election officer or designated law
- 27 enforcement officer to the main early voting polling place at the

- 1 close of voting each day.
- 2 (b) The unvoted ballots at the branch polling place[, other
- 3 than voting machine ballots, shall be retained or delivered with
- 4 the voted ballots of the same ballot style but in a separate locked
- 5 container.
- 6 (c) At [All voted and unvoted ballots shall be delivered by
- 7 an election officer or designated law enforcement officer to the
- 8 main polling place at] the close of early voting [on the last day of
- 9 voting at a [the] branch polling place:
- 10 (1) unvoted ballots shall be retained or delivered in
- 11 the manner described by Subsection (b);
- 12 (2) voted ballots to be counted using automatic
- 13 tabulating equipment shall be retained or delivered in the manner
- 14 described by Subsection (a); and
- 15 (3) voted ballots to be counted manually shall be:
- 16 (A) delivered by an election officer or
- 17 designated law enforcement officer to the main early voting polling
- 18 place; and
- 19 (B) set aside for subsequent delivery to the
- 20 early voting ballot board under Section 87.021.
- 21 (d) At the close of the polls on election day, voted early
- 22 voting ballots to be counted using automatic tabulating equipment
- 23 shall be delivered with the ballots voted on election day at the
- 24 same polling place to the central counting station according to
- 25 Section 87.129 and the procedures under Subchapter C, Chapter 127.
- SECTION 21. Section 87.021, Election Code, is amended to
- 27 read as follows:

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- 1 Sec. 87.021. BALLOTS AND OTHER MATERIALS DELIVERED TO
- 2 BOARD. The early voting clerk shall deliver to the early voting
- 3 ballot board:
- 4 (1) in an election in which regular paper ballots are
- 5 used for early voting by personal appearance, each ballot box, in
- 6 accordance with Section 85.032(b), containing the early voting
- 7 ballots voted by personal appearance to be counted manually and the
- 8 clerk's key to each box;
- 9 (2) the jacket envelopes containing the early voting
- 10 ballots voted by mail, regardless of the ballot type or voting
- 11 system used;
- 12 (3) the poll lists prepared in connection with early
- 13 voting by personal appearance;
- 14 (4) the list of registered voters used in conducting
- 15 early voting; and
- 16 (5) a ballot transmittal form that includes a
- 17 statement of the number of early voting ballots voted by mail,
- 18 regardless of the ballot type or voting system used, that are
- 19 delivered to the early voting ballot board, and in an election in
- 20 which regular paper ballots are used for early voting by personal
- 21 appearance, the number of names appearing on the poll lists
- 22 prepared in connection with early voting by personal appearance.
- SECTION 22. Section 87.022, Election Code, is amended to
- 24 read as follows:
- Sec. 87.022. TIME OF DELIVERY: GENERAL RULE. Except as
- 26 provided by Section 87.0221 or $[\tau]$ 87.0222, [87.023, or 87.024,] the
- 27 materials shall be delivered to the early voting ballot board under

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- 1 this subchapter during the time the polls are open on election day,
- 2 or as soon after the polls close as practicable, at the time or
- 3 times specified by the presiding judge of the board.
- 4 SECTION 23. Section 87.0241(b), Election Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (b) The board may not count early voting ballots until:
- 7 (1) the polls open on election day; or
- 8 (2) in an election conducted by an authority of a
- 9 county with a population of 100,000 or more, or conducted jointly
- 10 with such a county or conducted with such a county through a
- 11 contract for election services, the <u>fourth day before election day</u>
- 12 [end of the period for early voting by personal appearance].
- 13 SECTION 24. Section 87.103, Election Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 87.103. COUNTING BALLOTS AND PREPARING RETURNS. (a)
- 16 The [early voting electronic system ballots counted at a central
- 17 counting station, the] ballots cast by personal appearance [at
- 18 precinct polling places, and the ballots voted by mail shall be
- 19 tabulated separately and shall be separately reported on the
- 20 returns.
- 21 (b) The [early voting] returns prepared at the central
- 22 counting station must include any [early voting] results obtained
- 23 by the early voting ballot board under Subchapter D.
- SECTION 25. Section 87.104, Election Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- Sec. 87.104. DISPOSITION OF EARLY VOTING BALLOT BOARD
- 27 RETURNS AND OTHER RECORDS. Returns [Early voting returns] or other

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- 1 early voting election records to be delivered to the central
- 2 counting station under Section 87.063(b) [or 87.084(b)] shall be
- 3 delivered to the appropriate authorities with the counting station
- 4 records.
- 5 SECTION 26. Section 87.1231, Election Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 87.1231. EARLY VOTING BY MAIL VOTES REPORTED BY
- 8 PRECINCT. Not later than the time of the local canvass, the early
- 9 voting clerk shall deliver to the local canvassing authority a
- 10 report of the total number of early voting votes by mail for each
- 11 candidate or measure by election precinct. [The report may reflect
- 12 the total for votes by mail and the total for votes by personal
- 13 appearance.
- SECTION 27. Subchapter G, Chapter 87, Election Code, is
- 15 amended by adding Section 87.129 to read as follows:
- Sec. 87.129. DISPOSITION OF CERTAIN BALLOTS VOTED BY
- 17 PERSONAL APPEARANCE. Voted early voting ballots retained or
- 18 delivered to the main early voting polling place under Section
- 19 85.071(c)(2) shall be treated as ballots voted on election day at
- 20 the same polling place for purposes of processing and tabulation
- 21 under Chapter 65.
- SECTION 28. Section 102.003(b), Election Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- 24 (b) An application must [may] be submitted [after the last
- 25 day of the period for early voting by personal appearance and]
- 26 before 5 p.m. on election day.
- 27 SECTION 29. Section 127.131(a), Election Code, is amended

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(a) After the automatic counting of ballots [for each
