- 5 SECTION 1. Section 31.21(b), Penal Code, is amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 (b) A person is presumed to be authorized to possess a
- 8 catalytic converter that has been removed from a motor vehicle if
- 9 the person:
- 10 (1) is the owner, as defined by Section 601.002,
- 11 Transportation Code, of the vehicle from which the catalytic
- 12 converter was removed or is authorized by the vehicle owner to
- 13 possess the catalytic converter; or
- 14 (2) possesses the catalytic converter in the ordinary
- 15 course of the person's business, including in the ordinary course
- 16 of business of an entity described by Section 1956.123(1),
- 17 Occupations Code.
- 18 SECTION 2. Chapter 1956, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 19 adding Subchapter C-2 to read as follows:
- 20 SUBCHAPTER C-2. RESTRICTION ON SALE OF CATALYTIC CONVERTER REMOVED
- FROM MOTOR VEHICLE TO CERTAIN PERSONS
- Sec. 1956.130. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "motor

- Sec. 1956.131. APPLICABILITY. Notwithstanding any other
- 2 provision of this chapter, this subchapter applies to the sale by
- 3 any person, including a person described by Section 1956.002(1), of
- 4 <u>a catalytic converter removed from a motor vehicle to any other</u>
- 5 person.
- 6 Sec. 1956.132. OFFENSE: SALE OF CATALYTIC CONVERTER REMOVED
- 7 FROM MOTOR VEHICLE TO PERSON OTHER THAN METAL RECYCLING ENTITY. (a)
- 8 A person commits an offense if the person sells a catalytic
- 9 converter removed from a motor vehicle to a person who is not a
- 10 metal recycling entity registered under this chapter.
- 11 (b) An offense under this section is a state jail felony.
- 12 (c) If conduct constituting an offense under this section
- 13 <u>also constitutes an offense under another law, the actor may be</u>
- 14 prosecuted under this section, the other law, or both.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
