## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, State stipulates in Section law 2165.256, 2 Government Code, that a person specified in a concurrent resolution adopted by the legislature is eligible for burial in the State 3 Cemetery if the State Cemetery Committee finds that the person has 4 5 made a significant contribution to Texas history and, based on that finding, approves the person's burial; and 6

7 WHEREAS, A graduate of The University of Texas School of Law, Guy Herman was first elected as Travis County probate judge in 1985; 8 he has demonstrated exceptional wisdom and compassion in the 9 adjudication of sensitive matters relating to wills and estates, 10 11 guardianships, and mental health commitments, and as the county population has doubled, he has overseen the growth of the court, 12 training and guiding associate judges and mentoring many law clerks 13 14 who have gone on to success in probate practices; and

WHEREAS, During his long tenure as presiding judge for the 15 Statutory Probate Judges of Texas, Judge Herman has rendered 16 exceptional service to the legal community and the legislature, 17 recommending beneficial changes to state laws and collaborating 18 effectively on legislative matters with the Real Estate, Probate, 19 and Trust Law sections of the State Bar of Texas; in 1993, he was 20 21 elected president of the Texas College of Probate Judges, and he has served on numerous statewide and Supreme Court task forces over the 22 23 years; and

24 WHEREAS, From the very beginning of his career on the bench,

- Judge Herman has worked to protect vulnerable populations; his 1 efforts have been crucial in preserving optimal autonomy 2 independence for individuals with mental illness and 3 widespread adoption of warrantless detention rather than jailing 4 5 defendants prior to mental health treatment; moreover, he played a key role in the development of the county's hospital district, 6 which provides primary, specialty, behavioral, and dental health 7 8 care to residents with insufficient resources; in recent years, he has been instrumental in the creation of the Assisted Outpatient Services approach to meet mental health needs of defendants; Travis 10 County Integral Care recognized his outstanding record of service 11
- in his honor; and

  WHEREAS, In light of his noteworthy contributions to the Lone

  Star State, it is fitting that the Honorable Guy Herman be allowed

  to designate the State Cemetery as his final resting place; now,
