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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT relating to the abolition of the Research and Oversight Council on 2 3 Workers' Compensation and the transfer of certain statutory 4 functions of that entity to the Texas Workers' Compensation 5 Commission. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 401.011(38), Labor Code, is amended to 7 read as follows: 8 "Research <u>division</u> [center]" means the <u>division</u> 9 (38) of the commission [Texas Workers' Compensation Research Center] 10 established under Chapter 404. 11 SECTION 2. Section 402.011(b), Labor Code, is amended to 12 13 read as follows: 14 (b) A member is entitled to reimbursement for actual lost 15 wages or use of leave benefits, if any, for: 16 (1) attendance at commission meetings and hearings; preparation for a commission meeting, not to 17 (2) exceed two days in each calendar quarter; 18 (3) attendance at a subcommittee meeting, not to 19 20 exceed one day each month; 21 (4) attendance by the chair or vice chair of the commission at a legislative committee meeting if attendance is 22 23 requested by the committee chair; and 24 (5) attendance at a meeting by a member appointed to the [Research and Oversight Council on Workers' Compensation or 25 the] Texas Certified Self-Insured Guaranty Association. 26

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H.B. No. 118 SECTION 3. Section 402.085(a), Labor Code, is amended to 1 2 read as follows: 3 The commission shall release information on a claim to: (a) 4 (1) the Texas Department of Insurance for any 5 statutory or regulatory purpose; 6 (2) a legislative committee for legislative purposes; a state or federal elected official requested in 7 (3) 8 writing to provide assistance by a constituent who qualifies to obtain injury information under Section 402.084(b), if the request 9 for assistance is provided to the commission; 10 (4) the research division [Research and Oversight 11 Council on Workers' Compensation ] for research purposes; or 12 (5) the attorney general or another entity that 13 provides child support services under Part D, Title IV, Social 14 15 Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section 651 et seq.), relating to: (A) establishing, modifying, or enforcing a 16 17 child support or medical support obligation; or (B) locating an absent parent. 18 SECTION 4. Section 403.003(b), Labor Code, is amended to 19 read as follows: 20 21 In setting the rate of assessment, the commission may (b) not consider revenue or expenditures related to: 22 (1) the State Office of Risk Management; 23 24 (2) the research division [and oversight council on 25 workers' compensation]; or (3) any other revenue or expenditure excluded from 26 27 consideration by law.

H.B. No. 118 SECTION 5. Section 403.007(f), Labor Code, is amended to read as follows:

The commission's actuary or financial advisor shall 3 (f) report annually [biannually] to the commission [Research and 4 Oversight Council on Workers' Compensation] on the financial 5 6 condition and projected assets and liabilities of the subsequent injury fund. The commission shall make the reports available to 7 8 members of the legislature and the public. The commission may 9 purchase annuities to provide for payments due to claimants under this subtitle if the commission determines that the purchase of 10 annuities is financially prudent for the administration of the 11 fund. 12

27 SECTION 8. Section 404.002, Labor Code, is amended to read

1 as fol	lows:
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Sec. 404.002. DIVISION 2 [COUNCIL]; GENERAL POWERS AND The division [Research and Oversight Council 3 DUTIES. (a) on 4 Workers' Compensation] is an advisory body to the members of the commission. For the purposes of implementing this chapter, the 5 6 research division is administratively attached to the commission. The commission shall provide facilities for the division and 7 fiscal, personnel, and administrative support to the division, but 8 the division shall be independent of the direction of the 9 10 commission.

11 (b) Notwithstanding Section 402.021, the research director 12 shall report directly to the members of the commission.

13 (c) The division shall provide professional research and 14 data analysis services for use by policymakers, system 15 <u>administrators, and system stakeholders.</u> The <u>division</u> [<del>council</del>] 16 shall be operated in a manner that ensures that its research, 17 findings, and conclusions are factual, fair, and unbiased.

18 (d) [(b)] The division [council] shall conduct professional 19 studies and research related to:

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(1) the delivery of benefits;

21 (2) litigation and controversy related to workers' 22 compensation;

23 (3) insurance rates and rate-making procedures;
24 (4) rehabilitation and reemployment of injured
25 workers;
26 (5) workplace health and safety issues;

27 (6) the quality and cost of medical benefits;

H.B. No. 118 (7) the Texas Mutual Insurance Company and the impact of that company on the workers' compensation system; and

3 (8) other matters relevant to the cost, quality, and
4 operational effectiveness of the workers' compensation system.

(e) [(c)] In addition to the studies and research conducted 5 6 under Subsection (d) [(b)], the division [council] shall conduct studies and research related to drugs in the workplace, giving 7 8 priority to drug abuse in public and private establishments in which drug abuse could result in serious consequences to the 9 public. The studies and research must include a survey designed to 10 identify future needs and current efforts of employers to 11 counteract drug abuse and its effects in the workplace. 12

13 (f) [(d)] The division [council] shall identify, collect, 14 maintain, and analyze the key information required to assess the 15 operational effectiveness of the workers' compensation system. The 16 division [council] shall provide the information obtained under 17 this subsection to the members of the commission, the governor, and 18 the legislature on a quarterly basis.

19 (g) [(e)] The division [council], with the approval of the 20 <u>commission</u> [board], may apply for and spend federal funds to 21 implement this chapter.

22 SECTION 9. The heading to Section 404.003, Labor Code, is 23 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 404.003. <u>DIVISION</u> [COUNCIL] FUNDING; MAINTENANCE TAX.
SECTION 10. Sections 404.003(a), (b), and (e), Labor Code,
are amended to read as follows:

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(a) The <u>division</u> [council] is funded through the assessment

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1 of a maintenance tax collected annually from all insurance carriers
2 except governmental entities.

3 The commission shall set the rate of the maintenance tax (b) 4 for the division based on the expenditures authorized and the 5 receipts anticipated in legislative appropriations. The tax rate for insurance companies may not exceed one-tenth of one percent of 6 7 the correctly reported gross workers' compensation insurance 8 premiums. The tax rate for certified self-insurers may not exceed 9 one-tenth of one percent of the total tax base of all certified self-insurers, as computed under Section 407.103(b). 10

(e) Amounts received under this section shall be deposited
 in the state treasury to the credit of a special account to be used:

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(1) for the operation of the <u>division</u> [<del>council</del>]; and

14 (2) to reimburse the general revenue fund in15 accordance with Article 4.19, Insurance Code.

SECTION 11. Section 404.007, Labor Code, is amended to read as follows:

18Sec. 404.007. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMISSION19REGARDING DIVISION [BOARD]. (a) The commission [board] shall:

20 (1) approve the operating budget of the <u>division</u>

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than December 31 of each even-numbered year. The report must

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the activities of the <u>division</u> [council];

3 (2) identification of any problems in the workers' 4 compensation system, with recommendations <u>on how to improve the</u> 5 <u>system</u> [for regulatory and legislative action based on research or 6 <u>testimony</u>]; and

7 (3) the status of the effectiveness of the workers'
8 compensation system to provide adequate, equitable, and timely
9 benefits to injured workers at a reasonable cost to employers, with
10 recommendations for any additional necessary research.

(c) The <u>division</u> [board] shall publish and disseminate its studies to interested persons and may determine charges for the publications as necessary to achieve optimal dissemination.

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(d) The <u>commission</u> [board] may:

(1) delegate powers to the <u>research</u> [<del>executive</del>] director as it considers appropriate, including general guidance on the identification of information needs and the conduct of research;

19 (2) contract with other persons, including 20 institutions of higher education, for conducting economical 21 studies of high quality for the <u>division</u> [council]; and

22 (3) [contract with the commission for a fiscal, 23 personnel, or other support function;

24 [<del>(4)</del>] appoint expert advisory committees, composed of 25 <u>system stakeholders</u>, to provide technical assistance in conducting 26 research[<del>; and</del>

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[<del>(5) request reports and other information on workers'</del>

1	compensation from an entity listed in Subsection (a)(6). Requests
2	made under this subsection shall be reasonable in scope and shall

7	SECTION 12. Section 404.008, Labor Code, is amended to read
8	as follows:
9	Sec. 404.008. <u>RESEARCH</u> [EXECUTIVE] DIRECTOR;
10	APPROPRIATIONS REQUEST. (a) The <u>commission</u> [ <del>board</del> ] shall <u>appoint a</u>
11	research [employ an executive] director, who shall administer the
12	<u>division</u> [ <del>council</del> ] in accordance with <u>commission</u> [ <del>board</del> ] policies.
13	The <u>research</u> [ <del>executive</del> ] director serves at the pleasure of the
14	<pre>commission [board].</pre>
15	(b) The <u>research</u> [ <del>executive</del> ] director shall hire staff as
16	necessary to accomplish the objectives of the <u>division</u> [ <del>council</del> ],
17	and may delegate powers and duties to members of that staff as
18	necessary.
19	(c) The <u>research</u> [ <del>executive</del> ] director shall prepare a
20	request for legislative appropriations for the operations of the
21	division for consideration and approval by the commission

(d) The <u>research</u> [executive] director shall prepare
 annually a complete and detailed written report accounting for all

funds received and disbursed by the <u>division</u> [council] during the preceding fiscal year. The annual report must meet the reporting requirements applicable to financial reporting provided by the General Appropriations Act.

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5 [(e) The executive director shall develop an intra-agency 6 career ladder program that addresses opportunities for mobility and 7 advancement for employees within the council. The program shall 8 require intra-agency posting of all positions concurrently with any 9 public posting.

10 [(f) The executive director shall develop a system of annual 11 performance evaluations that are based on documented employee 12 performance. All merit pay for council employees must be based on 13 the system established under this subsection.

14 [(g) The executive director shall prepare and maintain a 15 written policy statement to assure implementation of a program of 16 equal employment opportunity under which all personnel 17 transactions are made without regard to race, color, disability, 18 sex, religion, age, or national origin. The policy statement must 19 include:

20 [(1) personnel policies, including policies relating 21 to recruitment, evaluation, selection, appointment, training, and 22 promotion of personnel that are in compliance with the requirements 23 of Chapter 21;

24 [(2) a comprehensive analysis of the council workforce
25 that meets federal and state guidelines;

23	[executive] director annually shall prepare a research agenda for
24	commission [board] review and approval.
25	(b) <u>With commission approval</u> , the division [ <del>The board</del> ]
26	shall publish annually in the Texas Register a proposed research
27	agenda and shall distribute the proposed agenda to educational

1 institutions in this state that have a demonstrated research
2 capacity.

3 (c) The <u>commission</u> [board] shall accept public comments on 4 the proposed agenda and shall conduct a public hearing on the agenda 5 if a hearing is requested by interested persons.

6 SECTION 14. Section 404.010, Labor Code, is amended to read 7 as follows:

8 Sec. 404.010. COORDINATION WITH OTHER STATE AGENCIES; 9 CONFIDENTIALITY. (a) As required to fulfill the objectives of the 10 <u>division</u> [<del>council</del>], the <u>division</u> [<del>council</del>] is entitled to access to 11 the files and records of:

(d) The identity of an individual or entity selected to

disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code.

Section 407A.301(a), Labor Code, as added by 5 H.B. 2095, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, is 6 7 amended to read as follows: 8 (a) Each group shall pay a self-insurance group maintenance tax under this section for: 9 the administration of the commission; 10 (1)the prosecution of workers' compensation insurance 11 (2) fraud in this state; and 12 the research division [Research and Oversight 13 (3) 14 Council on Workers' Compensation]. 15 SECTION 17. Sections 408.0221(f), (h), and (i), Labor Code, are amended to read as follows: 16 The advisory committee shall gather information from 17 (f) other entities, including the <u>research</u> division [Research and 18 Oversight Council on Workers' Compensation], the Texas Health Care 19 Information Council, the Texas Department of Insurance, the Texas 20 21 Department of Health, and the Employees Retirement System of Texas. 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1 SECTION 19. (a) The Research and Oversight Council on 2 Workers' Compensation and its board of directors are abolished on 3 the effective date of this Act.

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(b) All state records and other property, and unexpended and
unobligated appropriations of the Research and Oversight Council on
Workers' Compensation or its board as of August 31, 2003, are
transferred to the research division of the Texas Workers'
Compensation Commission for the dedicated purpose of implementing
Chapter 404, Labor Code, as amended by this Act.

10 (c) All employees as of August 31, 2003, of the Research and 11 Oversight Council on Workers' Compensation become employees of the 12 research division of the Texas Workers' Compensation Commission as 13 established under Chapter 404, Labor Code, as amended by this Act.

(d) Any reference in law to the Research and Oversight Council on Workers' Compensation, or to the board of directors of that entity, means the research division of the Texas Workers' Compensation Commission or the members of that commission, as appropriate.

(e) The special account created under Section 404.003, Labor Code, as that section existed immediately before amendment by this Act, is re-created and redesignated as a special account to be used for the purposes designated in Section 404.003, Labor Code, as amended by this Act.

SECTION 20. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate

1 effect, this Act takes effect November 1, 2003.
