3 August 2-3, 2003; and

5 Andy Davis are planned for August 2, and guest clergyman Dr. Leroy
6 Kemp will present the sermon at the August 3 morning service; and

7 WHEREAS, Since its beginning, the church has been blessed
8 with the leadership of many fine individuals, including the
9 Reverend Martin Van Buren Smith, a respected leader in the Belton
10 community during the late 1800s; today, Reverend Davis shares his

18 Fellowship Baptist Church; and
