RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The passing of Vernett Hicks of Corsicana on July 2 19, 2003, at the age of 78, has deeply saddened the family and many 3 friends of this beloved man; and

WHEREAS, A native Texan, he was born on February 2, 1925, in 4 5 the community of Cheneyboro; he graduated from Jackson High School in Corsicana, joined the United States Navy, and attained the rank 6 of second class petty officer before he was honorably discharged; 7 "Hicks," as he was affectionately called by many of his friends, 8 went on to earn a bachelor's degree in social studies from Wiley 9 College in Marshall and a master's degree in psychology from 10 11 Prairie View A&M University; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hicks began his exemplary career in education at Dunbar High School in Mexia, where he served as head football coach and won five district championships between 1948 and 1957; he next worked for the Port Arthur Independent School District as head of testing, a position he held for a brief time before returning to his hometown area; and

18 WHEREAS, In Corsicana, Mr. Hicks taught at Jackson and 19 Lincoln elementary schools and at Jackson High School until the 20 advent of desegregation in the mid-1960s; he then became the first 21 African American to teach at Collins Junior High School and 22 Corsicana High School; Mr. Hicks subsequently served as principal 23 at two local elementary schools and as an administrator with the 24 Corsicana Independent School District; and

WHEREAS, Following his retirement from the school district in 1988, he remained active in businesses as diverse as ranching, rental real estate, and house moving; in addition, he became the first African American to hold the office of constable in Navarro County; and

6 WHEREAS, Mr. Hicks married the former Vivian Bratcher on 7 November 30, 1955, and the couple enjoyed a warm and rewarding 8 relationship for nearly half a century; together, the two educators 9 served their community in a number of roles and were faithful 10 congregants of St. Andrew's United Methodist Church, where they 11 were instrumental in the recent building of a new sanctuary; and

12 WHEREAS, Devoted to his family, his profession, and his 13 community, Vernett Hicks enriched the lives of countless 14 individuals, and his caring spirit will long be remembered in years 15 to come; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas 16 17 Legislature, 1st Called Session, hereby pay tribute to the life of Vernett Hicks and extend deep sympathy to the members of his family: 18 to his wife, Vivian; to his son, Melvin Joe Hicks; to his 19 half-sister, Ada Brunson; to his aunts, Myrtle Padgett Davis and 20 21 Jettie B. Watson; to his cousins, Bobby and Curtis Sparks; to his grandchildren; and to the other relatives and many friends of this 22 esteemed gentleman; and, be it further 23
