WHEREAS, He enlisted in the United States Navy in 1950, and over the course of his distinguished service he was awarded four Good Conduct medals, the National Defense Service Medal, the United Nations Service Medal, the Korean Service Medal, and a Navy Unit Commendation; he received an honorable discharge from the Navy on July 2, 1969, as a master-at-arms; and

WHEREAS, After leaving military service, Mr. Holleyman embarked on a varied career in law enforcement, which included employment with the Pinkerton Detective Agency, Sanger-Harris Department Store, and the Fort Worth Police Department; he graduated from Odessa's Regional Police Academy in 1985, and he joined the staff of the Terrell County Sheriff's Department shortly thereafter; in the mid 1990s, he retired as the department's chief deputy and went on to serve as the constable for Precincts 1, 3, and
