WHEREAS, Newton Isaac Collins was born and educated in Alabama and brought his carpenter and entrepreneurial skills to Austin in the mid-1800s to build churches and homes; he and his wife, Elizabeth Henderson Collins, had eight children who inherited their parents' carpenter and farming skills and who have continued their parents' legacy through property ownership and stewardship; and

WHEREAS, One of the main events planned for the October family reunion is a ceremony which will be conducted by the

Buffalo Soldiers Association to honor family members who have served in the military; and

WHEREAS, The Collins and Rucker family members are successful and productive men and women who have contributed greatly to their communities through their leadership, integrity, and concern for others, and they deserve to be proud of their many successful endeavors; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Senate of the State of Texas,
