WHEREAS, He is especially proud of his accomplishments with his Tour to Stop the Violence project, in which he is featured in POLICE ICE; it has been hailed as a dynamic crime prevention and safety education endeavor that strives to teach student audiences about the realities and dangers of strangers, guns, drug abuse, and street gang violence; his POLICE ICE presentations focus on building character through pride, integrity, appreciation of diversity, conflict resolution techniques, and good behavior; the improvisational humor and positive rap music of Tour to Stop the Violence have proven to be inspirational to thousands of young Texans and their parents and teachers; and

WHEREAS, In 1992, his prevention strategy was featured on the nationally televised series "TOP COPS," and he was honored for his outstanding efforts to reduce violence at a White House reception in 1994, when President William Jefferson Clinton presented him with an award; locally, he has been recognized as Officer of the Year and has received more than 300 individual commendations; and

WHEREAS, Detective Mark Gil has long held the high regard of his colleagues and the community; in retirement, he will devote his time and energy to bringing his Tour to Stop the Violence and POLICE ICE project before a wider audience to better serve the community; now, therefore, be it
