**Estimated Two-year Net Impact to General Revenue Related Funds** for HB108, As Introduced: a negative impact of (\$3,782,947) through the biennium ending August 31, 2005.

The bill would make no appropriation but could provide the legal basis for an appropriation of funds to implement the provisions of the bill.

#### **Fiscal Analysis**

The bill would require the Health and Human Services Commission or relevant Medicaid operating agency to provide licensed psychologist or licensed marriage and family therapist services to certain Medicaid recipients. The bill would reinstate the law previous to House Bill 2292, 78<sup>th</sup> Legislature.

#### Methodology

The Health and Human Services Commission estimated that the provision of these services would cost approximately \$4.8 million in All Funds per year (\$4.7 million for psychologist services and \$100,000 for marriage and family therapist services). It is estimated that General Revenue (Match for Medicaid) would account for approximately 40 percent of expenditures, with Federal Funds comprising the

remaining 60 percent.

# Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
