WHEREAS, In addition to his professional achievements, Mr. Dillard gave generously of his time and financial resources to myriad causes and charities; while he avoided public recognition for his generosity, Mr. Dillard greatly benefited such local projects as the North Texas Rehabilitation Center and Texas Ranch Roundup; and
