WHEREAS, Today this charming town remains a living testament to the courage, talent, and vision of the men and women who shaped the Old West; Bandera, which once served as the staging area for early cattle drives up the Western Trail, has been home to countless champion cowboys and is considered by many to be the Cowboy Capital of the World; since 1920 the community has been a popular tourist destination, each year drawing visitors from around the state and beyond to attractions that include area resorts, dude ranches, rodeo venues, and hunting and camp grounds; and
