3 of South Texas migrant students; and

4           WHEREAS, Incorporated in 1967, this nonprofit organization  
5 provides academic and vocational training to migrant and seasonal  
6 farmworkers in an attempt to further the economic self-sufficiency  
7 of participants; many young people in the Eagle Pass area have  
8 benefited from the MET Youth Program, which has given migrant  
9 students an opportunity to finish high school or earn a GED; and

10           WHEREAS, For farmworker teens, this program puts within reach  
11 what may have once seemed an unattainable goal, as harvest often  
12 calls migrant families away before each school year ends, keeping  
13 these students from completing their studies; and

14           WHEREAS, Education empowers children to reach their full  
15 potential for healthy and productive living through the acquisition  
16 of increased skills and knowledge; the MET Youth Program has helped  
17 countless Lone Star youths achieve goals and make dreams of a bright  
18 future a sound reality; now, therefore, be it
