## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the right to refuse certain immunizations.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 38.001(c), Education Code, as amended by
- 5 Chapter 198, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003,
- 6 is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) Immunization is not required for a person's admission to
- 8 any elementary or secondary school if the person applying for
- 9 admission:
- 10 (1) submits to the admitting official:
- 11 (A) an affidavit or a certificate signed by a
- 12 physician who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine
- in the United States, in which it is stated that, in the physician's
- 14 opinion, the immunization required would be injurious [poses a
- 15 significant risk] to the health and well-being of the applicant or
- any member of the applicant's family or household; or
- 17 (B) an affidavit signed by the applicant or, if a
- 18 minor, by the applicant's parent or guardian stating that the
- 19 [applicant declines] immunization conflicts with the tenets and
- 20 practice of a recognized church or religious denomination of which
- 21 the applicant is an adherent or member, except that this exemption
- 22 does not apply in times of emergency or epidemic declared by the
- 23 commissioner of public health [for reasons of conscience, including
- 24 a religious belief]; or

- 1 (2) is a member of the armed forces of the United
- 2 States and is on active duty.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 51.933(d), Education Code, as amended by
- 4 Chapter 198, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003,
- 5 is amended to read as follows:
- 6 (d) No form of immunization is required for a person's
- 7 admission to an institution of higher education if the person
- 8 applying for admission:

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- (1) submits to the admitting official:
- 10 (A) an affidavit or a certificate signed by a
- 11 physician who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine
- 12 within the United States in which it is stated that, in the
- 13 physician's opinion, the immunization required would be injurious
- 14 [poses a significant risk] to the health and well-being of the
- applicant or any member of the applicant's family or household; or
- 16 (B) an affidavit signed by the applicant or, if a
- 17 minor, by the applicant's parent or guardian stating that the
- 18 [applicant declines] immunization conflicts with the tenets and
- 19 practice of a recognized church or religious denomination of which
- 20 the applicant is an adherent or member [for reasons of conscience,
- 21 <u>including a religious belief</u>]; or
- 22 (2) is a member of the armed forces of the United
- 23 States and is on active duty.
- SECTION 3. Section 161.004(d), Health and Safety Code, as
- 25 amended by Chapter 198, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular
- 26 Session, 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- 27 (d) A child is exempt from an immunization required by this

- 1 section if:
- 2 (1) immunization conflicts with the tenets of an
- 3 organized religion to which a parent, managing conservator, or
- 4 guardian belongs [states that the immunization is being declined
- 5 for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief]; or
- 6 (2) the immunization is medically contraindicated
- 7 based on an examination of the child by [the opinion of] a physician
- 8 licensed by any state in the United States [who has examined the
- 9 child].
- SECTION 4. Section 42.043(d), Human Resources Code, as
- 11 amended by Chapter 198, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular
- 12 Session, 2003, is amended to read as follows:
- 13 (d) No immunization may be required for admission to a
- 14 facility regulated under this chapter if a person applying for a
- child's admission submits one of the following affidavits:
- 16 (1) an affidavit signed by a licensed physician
- 17 stating that the immunization would be injurious [poses a
- 18 significant risk] to the health and well-being of the child or a
- 19 member of the child's family or household; or
- 20 (2) an affidavit signed by the child's parent or
- 21 guardian stating that the [applicant declines] immunization
- 22 <u>conflicts with the tenets and practices of a recognized religious</u>
- 23 <u>organization of which the applicant is an adherent or a member</u> [for
- 24 reasons of conscience, including a religious belief].
- 25 SECTION 5. The following laws are repealed:
- 26 (1) Sections 38.001(c-1) and (f), Education Code, as
- 27 added by Chapter 198, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular

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- 1 Session, 2003;
- 2 (2) Section 51.933(d-1), Education Code, as added by
- 3 Chapter 198, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003;
- 4 (3) Section 161.0041, Health and Safety Code, as added
- 5 by Chapter 198, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session,
- 6 2003; and
- 7 (4) Section 42.043(d-1), Human Resources Code, as
- 8 added by Chapter 198, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular
- 9 Session, 2003.
- 10 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 15 legislative session.
