## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to an appropriation to the Texas Tech University Health

Sciences Center for the purpose of attaining accreditation of a

four-year medical school in El Paso and authorizing the issuance of

revenue bonds for the center for an academic building to support the

center's educational programs in El Paso.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

8 SECTION 1. (a) In addition to other amounts that may be

expended for this purpose, the amount of \$2 million is appropriated

out of the Texas Enterprise Fund to the Texas Tech University Health

Sciences Center for the state fiscal biennium beginning September

12 1, 2003, for the purpose of initiating the actions and processes,

13 including faculty recruitment, obtaining equipment, and

reimbursing the health sciences center for debt service for revenue

bonds authorized by Section 55.1749, Education Code, as added by

this Act, necessary to attain accreditation of a four-year medical

18 (b) The amount of the Texas Enterprise Fund available to the

office of the governor for grants under Section 481.078, Government

20 Code, as added by Chapter 978, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular

Session, 2003, is correspondingly reduced by \$2 million.

22 SECTION 2. In addition to the funds appropriated in Section

23 1 of this Act, for the state fiscal biennium beginning September 1,

24 2003, the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center may expend

- 1 any gifts, grants, donations, and other funds identified by the
- 2 center for the purposes stated in Section 1 of this Act, in an
- 3 amount estimated to be not less than \$3 million.
- 4 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 55, Education Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 55.1749 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 55.1749. TEXAS TECH UNIVERSITY SYSTEM; ADDITIONAL
- 7 REVENUE BONDS. (a) In addition to the other authority granted by
- 8 this subchapter, the board of regents of the Texas Tech University
- 9 System may acquire, purchase, construct, improve, renovate,
- 10 enlarge, or equip property, buildings, structures, or other
- 11 <u>facilities</u>, including roads and related infrastructure, for the
- 12 Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center for an academic
- 13 building to support the center's educational programs in the city
- of El Paso, to be financed by the issuance of bonds in accordance
- 15 with this subchapter, including bonds issued in accordance with a
- 16 systemwide revenue financing program and secured as provided by
- that program, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$45
- 18 million.
- 19 (b) The board may pledge irrevocably to the payment of the
- 20 bonds authorized by Subsection (a) all or any part of the revenue
- 21 <u>funds of Texas Tech University or the Texas Tech University Health</u>
- 22 Sciences Center, including student tuition charges. The amount of
- 23 <u>a pledge made under this subsection may not be reduced or abrogated</u>
- 24 while the bonds for which the pledge is made, or bonds issued to
- 25 refund those bonds, are outstanding.
- 26 (c) If sufficient funds are not available to the board to
- 27 meet its obligations under this section, the board may transfer

- 1 funds between Texas Tech University and the Texas Tech University
- 2 Health Sciences Center to ensure the most equitable and efficient
- 3 allocation of available resources for Texas Tech University and the
- 4 Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center to carry out their
- 5 duties and purposes.
- 6 (d) Any portion of the proceeds of bonds authorized by this
- 7 section that is not required for the academic building described by
- 8 Subsection (a) may be used by the Texas Tech University System to
- 9 renovate existing structures and facilities of the Texas Tech
- 10 University Health Sciences Center.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 16 legislative session.
