4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 901.501, Occupations Code, as amended by
6	Chapter 525, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003,
7	is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to
8	read as follows:
9	(a) On a determination that a ground for discipline exists
10	under Section 901.502, after notice and hearing as provided by
11	Section 901.509, the board may:
12	(1) revoke a certificate, firm license, or practice
13	privilege issued under this chapter;

- 14 (2) suspend [under any terms] a certificate, firm
- 15 license, practice privilege, or license issued under this chapter
- 16 for a period not to exceed five years;
- 17 (3) refuse to renew a license;
- 18 (4) place a license holder on probation;
- 19 (5) reprimand a license holder;
- 20 (6) limit the scope of a license holder's practice;
- 21 (7) require a license holder to complete a peer review
- 22 program conducted in the manner prescribed by the board;
- 23 (8) require a license holder to complete a continuing
- 24 education program specified by the board;

- 1 (9) impose on a license holder the direct
- 2 administrative costs incurred by the board in taking action under
- 3 Subdivisions (1) through (8);
- 4 (10) require a license holder to pay restitution as
- 5 provided by Section 901.6015;
- 6 (11) impose an administrative penalty under
- 7 Subchapter L; or
- 8 (12) impose any combination of the sanctions provided
- 9 by this subsection.
- 10 (c) On a determination, after notice and hearing as required
- 11 by this subchapter, that a license holder whose license suspension
- 12 has been probated has violated the terms of the probation order, the
- 13 board may rescind the probation and enforce the board's original
- 14 action suspending the person's license.
- SECTION 2. The change in law made by Section 901.501(c),
- Occupations Code, as added by this Act, applies only to an action by
- 17 the Texas State Board of Public Accountancy to rescind the
- 18 probation of a license suspension that is initiated on or after the
- 19 effective date of this Act. An action by the board to rescind the
- 20 probation of a license suspension that was initiated before the
- 21 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 22 date the action was initiated, and the former law is continued in
- 23 effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 25 last day of the legislative session.
