## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to eligibility to receive a TEXAS grant.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Section 56.304(e), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:
- (e) A person's eligibility for a TEXAS grant ends on the 6 sixth anniversary of the initial award of a TEXAS grant to the 7 person [and the person's enrollment in an eligible institution], 8 unless the person is provided additional time during which the 9 person may receive a TEXAS grant under this subsection. 10 coordinating board shall adopt rules to provide a person who is 11 12 otherwise eligible to receive a TEXAS grant additional time during which the person may receive a TEXAS grant in the event of a 13 14 hardship or other good cause shown that prevents the person from continuing the person's enrollment during the period the person 15
- 16 would otherwise have been eligible to receive a TEXAS grant,
- 17 including a showing of a severe illness or other debilitating
- 18 condition or that the person is or was responsible for the care of a
- 19 sick, injured, or needy person.
- 20 SECTION 2. Subchapter M, Chapter 56, Education Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Section 56.3042 to read as follows:
- Sec. 56.3042. EXTENSION OF INITIAL ELIGIBILITY FOR GRANT.
- 23 A student enrolled at an eligible institution who does not meet the
- requirements of Section 56.304(a)(5) but who otherwise qualifies

- 1 for a grant under that section is eligible to receive an initial
- 2 TEXAS grant if, as determined by the coordinating board, the
- 3 student:
- 4 (1) previously applied for and was eligible to receive
- 5 an initial TEXAS grant under Section 56.304 on enrollment at an
- 6 eligible institution but did not receive an initial grant solely
- 7 because of insufficient funding for the grant program; and
- 8 (2) is enrolled for at least three-fourths of a full
- 9 course load for an undergraduate student.
- SECTION 3. Section 56.305(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 (a) After initially qualifying for and receiving a TEXAS
- 13 grant, a person may continue to receive a TEXAS grant during each
- 14 semester or term in which the person is enrolled at an eligible
- 15 institution only if the person:
- 16 (1) meets financial need requirements as defined by
- 17 the coordinating board;
- 18 (2) is enrolled in an undergraduate degree or
- 19 certificate program at an eligible institution;
- 20 (3) is enrolled for at least three-fourths of a full
- 21 course load for an undergraduate student, as determined by the
- 22 coordinating board;
- 23 (4) makes satisfactory academic progress toward an
- 24 undergraduate degree or certificate; and
- 25 (5) complies with any additional nonacademic
- 26 requirement adopted by the coordinating board.
- 27 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act relating to

- 1 the eligibility of a person to receive a TEXAS grant applies
- 2 beginning with TEXAS grants awarded for the 2004-2005 academic
- 3 year. The eligibility of a person to receive a TEXAS grant for an
- 4 academic year before the 2004-2005 academic year is governed by the
- 5 applicable law in effect immediately before the effective date of
- 6 this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 7 purpose.
- 8 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect February 1, 2004.
