## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1-8 WHEREAS, The luminescence of myriad stars has long shone 1-9 forth from the city of Kilgore; and

1-10 WHEREAS, Among the brightest of those lights has been Van 1-11 Cliburn, the renowned classical pianist, who lived there in his 1-12 youth; in addition, Kilgore was the birthplace of Alice Lon, a 1-13 vocalist who won widespread popularity as the Champagne Lady on The 1-14 Lawrence Welk Show in the 1950s and who went on to perform for two 1-15 decades in nightclubs and in concerts; and 1-16 WHEREAS, For 18 seasons, the actors and actresses of

1-16 WHEREAS, For 18 seasons, the actors and actresses of 1-17 Kilgore's annual Texas Shakespeare Festival have brought the 1-18 splendor of the Bard's plays to the stage, in what has been 1-19 acclaimed as the best Shakespeare festival in the state; equally 1-20 dedicated to their craft are the famed Kilgore College Rangerettes, 1-21 who have dazzled audiences overseas, at the 2001 presidential 1-22 inaugural parade, and at every Cotton Bowl since 1951; Kilgore 1-23 itself has also been the star of the show in an episode of the 1-24 television travel magazine *Show Me Texas*; and

1-25 WHEREAS, Once a quiet rural community, Kilgore saw its name 1-26 blazed across Texas with the discovery of oil around the city in the 1-27 fall of 1930; situated near the heart of the East Texas oil field, 1-28 the largest such field in the lower 48 states, the town at one time 1-29 boasted a downtown block with the densest concentration of oil 1-30 derricks anywhere on the globe; in the late summer of 1931, as 1-31 tumultuous conditions continued to beset the new boomtown, the 1-32 state sent a star of its own, the legendary Texas Ranger Manuel T. 1-33 "Lone Wolf" Gonzaullas, to help restore order; and

1-34 WHEREAS, During World War II, oil from the East Texas field 1-35 helped to fuel the Allied effort; today, more than 60 oil derricks 1-36 dot the Kilgore skyline, and each is surmounted by a star that is 1-37 lit after dark--a reminder that the Stars and Stripes of our country 1-38 wave free in part because of the major contribution that East Texas 1-39 oil made to the Allied victory; and

1-40 WHEREAS, In view of these many associations with stellar 1-41 individuals, institutions, and contributions in the nation's 1-42 behalf, the Kilgore Chamber of Commerce is seeking appropriate 1-43 recognition for this outstanding community; now, therefore, be it

1-44 RESOLVED, That the 78th Legislature of the State of Texas, 1-45 3rd Called Session, hereby designate Kilgore as the official Texas 1-46 City of Stars.
