1           WHEREAS, On October 5, 2003, the members of Mount Pleasant  
2 Baptist Church are celebrating two momentous events in the history  
3 of their church -- 127 years of service to residents of the Houston  
4 metropolitan community and the dedication of a Texas historical  
5 marker; and

6           WHEREAS, Located at 4819 Hershe at Solo Street in Houston's  
7 Fifth Ward, the church has played a key role in the spiritual  
8 development of countless Texans since its establishment in 1876;  
9 and

10           WHEREAS, Over the course of a remarkable history spanning  
11 nearly 13 decades, the church has benefited from the leadership of  
12 only five pastors, including the Reverend Roy L. Jackson, who today  
13 leads the congregation in offering support, hope, and guidance to  
14 those in need through the church's various ministries; and

15           WHEREAS, For 127 years, Mount Pleasant Baptist Church has  
16 provided outstanding spiritual leadership and moral guidance to  
17 families living in the Bayou City; the church remains a tribute to  
18 its leaders and laity who through the years have devoted their time,  
19 energy, and resources to ensure its continued existence as a house  
20 of worship; now, therefore, be it

23 Baptist Church on the occasion of its 127th anniversary and on the
