

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The year 2003 marks a new chapter in the history of
2 Spring Tabernacle, as congregants celebrate the opening of a
3 contemporary worship center; and

4 WHEREAS, Founded on February 8, 1973, by Bishop C. G. Green
5 and his family, the tabernacle has experienced tremendous growth
6 since erecting its first sanctuary; over the years, the tabernacle
7 expanded to include five acres, a second building to accommodate
8 the growing membership, and a Family Life Center, complete with
9 gymnasium, fellowship hall, kitchen, classrooms, and offices; and

10 WHEREAS, In 1996, Spring Tabernacle purchased an additional
11 45 acres on which "Samaritan Village" will be built; this noble
12 endeavor will enable the church to better serve the needs of the
13 community and will include a home for homeless children, a drug and
14 alcohol recovery facility, and nursing care for the elderly; and

15 WHEREAS, The newest addition to the tabernacle campus is a
16 spacious, state-of-the-art worship center capable of seating more
17 than 2,000 people; blessed with warm fellowship and inspirational
18 teaching, the congregation of Spring Tabernacle will continue to
19 grow, and it is a pleasure to join in celebrating the completion of
20 this important new building; now, therefore, be it

21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas
22 Legislature, 3rd Called Session, hereby congratulate Bishop C. G.
23 Green and the congregation of Spring Tabernacle and extend to them
24 sincere best wishes for the future; and, be it further
