1           WHEREAS, Robert M. "Bob" Leibrock of Midland is the recipient  
2 of the 2003 Top Pioneer Award from the Permian Basin Petroleum  
3 Association; and

4           WHEREAS, After earning a degree in petroleum engineering from  
5 The University of Texas (UT), he embarked on a highly successful  
6 career in the oil industry, initially working with Stanolind Oil  
7 and Gas Company, which he left for a time to serve as a member of  
8 the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers during World War II; and

9           WHEREAS, In 1955, he became the first person in Midland to  
10 establish a company that offered comprehensive reservoir  
11 engineering services; this dynamic entrepreneur went on to found  
12 and serve as an officer and/or director of numerous businesses,  
13 including Amerind Oil Company, in which he partners today with his  
14 older son; and

15           WHEREAS, Mr. Leibrock met and married Prudie Pinkerton while  
16 working in Tulsa, and the couple were blessed with two children,  
17 Robert and Eric; in 1953, he moved his family to Midland, where he  
18 has long been a dedicated civic leader sharing his time and  
19 resources in behalf of, among others, Midland College, the Boy  
20 Scouts of America, the Abell-Hanger Foundation, Memorial Christian  
21 Church, the Permian Basin Section of the Society of Petroleum  
22 Engineers, and the Permian Basin Petroleum Association; and

23           WHEREAS, Together with his wife, Mr. Leibrock established and  
24 funded the first fully endowed professorship at Brite Divinity

1 School and the Harold Glen Brown Chair as well as the Robert M.  
2 Leibrock Friends of Alec Excellence Fund for scholarships at UT;  
3 and

4 WHEREAS, His exceptional contributions to his profession and  
5 to his fellow Texans were recognized with his receipt of the Top  
6 Hand award from the Permian Basin Petroleum Association in 1994 and  
7 with his designation as a distinguished graduate of the UT College  
8 of Engineering in 1995; in 1999, the new student housing complex at  
9 Brite Divinity School was named Leibrock Village in his honor; and

10 WHEREAS, Bob Leibrock exemplifies the qualities of  
11 generosity, integrity, and commitment in all his endeavors, and he  
12 is truly worthy of special recognition at this time; now,  
13 therefore, be it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas  
15 Legislature, 3rd Called Session, hereby congratulate Robert M.  
16 "Bob" Leibrock on his receipt of the 2003 Top Pioneer Award from the  
17 Permian Basin Petroleum Association and extend to him best wishes
