2 community leader and activist on September 10, 2003, when Charles
3 Hallmark passed away, leaving a host of friends and admirers to
4 deeply mourn his untimely death; and

5 WHEREAS, Mr. Hallmark selflessly devoted much of his life to
6 making his community a better place; since 1998, this noble
7 gentleman lent full-time support to the many important causes he
8 aided, including the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, Project
9 Transitions, and the Texas Abortion and Reproductive Rights Action
10 League; and

11 WHEREAS, An activist in the fight against acquired
12 immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS), this exceptional Texan worked
13 with AIDS Services of Austin, where he helped to promote AIDS
14 education and understanding and organized annual fund-raisers like
15 the AIDS Walk of Austin; and

16 WHEREAS, Those who were privileged to know Charles Hallmark
17 will not quickly forget the rare courage and compassion he
18 displayed in every facet of his life; demonstrating an unyielding
19 determination to correct society's injustices, his dedication
20 earned him the lasting respect and affection of countless friends
21 and community residents, and his spirit will forever brighten and
22 warm their hearts; now, therefore, be it
