1           WHEREAS, The Pecos community lost a most distinguished  
2 resident when longtime dentist and former city councilman and  
3 school board member Dr. Elvia Reynolds passed away at the age of 78;  
4 and

5           WHEREAS, After serving in World War II, Dr. Reynolds attended  
6 dental school in St. Louis, Missouri, graduating in March 1954;  
7 when he became a licensed dentist, he moved with his wife, Norma  
8 Jean, and their three children to Pecos, where, for the next 49  
9 years, he served the dental needs of area residents as an  
10 orthodontist; and

11           WHEREAS, Dr. Reynolds made significant contributions to his  
12 community as a board member and president of the  
13 Pecos-Barstow-Toyah Independent School District and later as a city  
14 council member; in addition, he was a member and past president of  
15 the Rotary Club, an elder for the Church of Christ, and a board  
16 member for Medina Children's Home; and

17           WHEREAS, Through hard work and a deep commitment to making  
18 his town a better place in which to live, Dr. Reynolds positively  
19 influenced the lives of many people, and he will not soon be  
20 forgotten; now, therefore, be it

21           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas  
22 Legislature, 3rd Called Session, hereby pay tribute to the life of  
23 Dr. Elvia Reynolds and extend deepest sympathy to the members of his  
24 family: to his beloved wife, Norma Jean Reynolds; to his sons,

1 Randy Reynolds and Danny Reynolds; to his daughter, Gayle R. Britt;  
2 to his sisters, Dale Meyer and Dot King; to his eight grandchildren  
3 and five great-grandchildren; and to his other relatives and many  
4 friends; and, be it further
