1 WHEREAS, The retirement of Ronald J. "Ron" Glenn of Wichita
2 Falls concludes a notable 25-year association with the Red River
3 Authority of Texas; and

4 WHEREAS, Mr. Glenn began his career as a resident engineer in
5 1978, became assistant general manager the following year, and was
6 promoted to general manager in 1985, and in retirement, he will
7 serve as a technical advisor; he has carried on a family legacy of
8 service, for his father, C. O. Glenn, served on the first Red River
9 Authority of Texas board of directors; and

10 WHEREAS, Recognized as one of the state's experts on water
11 issues, Mr. Glenn helped prepare water quality assessment
12 information for the Clean Rivers Program that is used as a guide by
13 other Texas river authorities; moreover, his judicious leadership
14 has been of great benefit to the Regional Water Planning Groups
15 since their inception, as has his involvement with the Red
16 River/Wichita River Chloride Control Project; and

17 WHEREAS, A veteran of the United States Marine Corps, he went
18 on to earn bachelor's degrees in business administration and
19 communication engineering from The University of Texas at Dallas
20 and attained a first class radiotelephone license from the Federal
21 Communications Commission; and

22 WHEREAS, Mr. Glenn has contributed his time and talents to
23 numerous professional organizations, including the American Water
24 Works Association, the National Water Resource Association, the

1 Nortex Regional Planning Commission, and the Texas Water
2 Conservation Association, among others; he is also a member of the
3 Masonic Grand Lodge of Texas; and

4 WHEREAS, Throughout his career, Ron Glenn has exemplified
5 integrity and dedication and has earned the lasting respect of all
6 who have been privileged to work with him, and it is a distinct
7 pleasure to honor him at this time; now, therefore, be it

8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas
9 Legislature, 3rd Called Session, hereby commend Ronald J. "Ron"
10 Glenn for his notable career with the Red River Authority of Texas
11 and extend to him best wishes for the future; and, be it further

12 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
13 prepared for Mr. Glenn as an expression of high regard by the Texas
14 House of Representatives.
