WHEREAS, Rosa served as the women's activities director for the Texas AFL-CIO, and she is now retiring as the organization's director of Community Services/Volunteers; in this position, she has coordinated union disaster relief operations, voter registration and get-out-the-vote drives, lobbying activities on specific issues, and preparations for special labor events; and

WHEREAS, A leading figure in the Texas labor movement, Rosa has played a major role in the recruitment of capable women into the union cause; and

WHEREAS, An exemplary citizen, Rosa served as a state vice president of the Texas Coalition of Labor Union Women, was a

founder of the Texas Consumer Association, and is a former member of the Texas Judicial Conduct Commission; and
