4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 7, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 7.029 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 7.029. POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION SURVEY. (a) The
8	agency shall develop a postsecondary education survey that a public
9	high school may use to monitor the postsecondary education plans of
10	seniors at the high school.
11	(b) Not later than January 1, 2005, the agency shall post
12	the survey developed under Subsection (a) on the agency's website.
13	As soon as practicable after posting the survey on the website, the
14	agency shall notify each school district that is located in a
15	municipality with a population of at least one million of the
16	availability of the survey.
17	(c) A counselor at a high school may administer the survey
18	to seniors. The survey must include questions to obtain the
19	following information:
20	(1) whether the student is planning to apply or has
21	applied for admission to a postsecondary educational institution;
22	(2) the name of any postsecondary educational
23	institution to which the student is planning to apply or has applied
24	for admission, if applicable;

1	(3) the name of any postsecondary educational
2	institution to which the student has been accepted for admission,
3	if applicable; and
4	(4) the name of the postsecondary educational
5	institution to which the student has been accepted for admission
6	and is planning to attend, if applicable.
7	(d) This section expires August 1, 2006.
8	SECTION 2. The Texas Education Agency shall develop the
9	postsecondary education survey as required by Section 7.029,
10	Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after
11	the effective date of this Act.
12	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 16 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the 17 legislative session.
