HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Blood-related cancers currently afflict more than 2 700,000 Americans, and an estimated 110,000 new cases are diagnosed 3 each year; and

WHEREAS, In 2004 alone, an estimated 60,500 men, women, and children in the United States will die from leukemia, lymphoma, and myeloma, and leukemias are the leading fatal cancers in young men and women under the age of 20; and

8 WHEREAS, The Leukemia and Lymphoma Society is dedicated to 9 the eradication of these blood-related cancers through research 10 efforts and to the improvement of the quality of life of the many 11 Americans who suffer from these diseases; to that end, patients and 12 their families in Texas benefit greatly from the care and services 13 offered by the society's office in Houston; and

14 WHEREAS, Committed to the search for cures and the support of State, 15 treatment in the Lone Star the Texas House of Representatives and Senate encourage private efforts to increase 16 research funding and to facilitate education programs that address 17 18 these diseases; and

WHEREAS, The State of Texas joins with the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society in its mission to enhance the understanding of blood-related cancers, to support the provision of quality care and treatment to those individuals suffering from those diseases, and to encourage the funding of research programs aimed at finding a cure; now, therefore, be it

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1 RESOLVED, That the 78th Legislature of the State of Texas, 2 4th Called Session, hereby designate September 2004 as Leukemia and 3 Lymphoma Awareness Month in Texas and pay tribute to those engaged 4 in the fight against these diseases.
