H.J.R. No. 8

A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 proposing a constitutional amendment prohibiting the taxation of
2 the sale or use of certain food, drinks, and medicine.

3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Article VIII, Texas Constitution, is amended by
5 adding Section 25 to read as follows:

6 Sec. 25. The legislature may not enact a general law that
7 would impose a state tax on the sale or use of:

8 (1) food or a drink that was not subject to taxation
9 under Chapter 151, Tax Code, on January 1, 2004; or

10 (2) a medicine that was not subject to taxation under
11 Chapter 151, Tax Code, on January 1, 2004.

12 SECTION 2. The following temporary provision is added to
13 the Texas Constitution:

14 TEMPORARY PROVISION. (a) This temporary provision applies
15 to the constitutional amendment proposed by the 78th Legislature,
16 4th Called Session, 2004, prohibiting the taxation of the sale or
17 use of certain food, drinks, and medicine, and expires December 31,
18 2006.

19 (b) If the 78th Legislature, during the 4th Called Session
20 or a later special session, enacts a general law prohibited by
21 Section 25, Article VIII, of this constitution, the portion of the
22 general law that violates that section expires January 1, 2005.

23 SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
24 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 2, 2004.
