WHEREAS, Born in Mabank on March 18, 1981, Sergeant Moreno, 9 affectionately known as "Chito" to his family and friends, joined 10 11 the U.S. Army after graduating from Terrell High School in 1999; 12 stationed at various bases around the country, he married another 13 dedicated soldier, Teresa Moreno, and they were blessed with two 14 children; a devoted father with a ready, radiant smile and a contagious love of life, Sergeant Moreno cherished each moment that 15 he spent with his beloved Dominique and Marrisol; and 16

17 WHEREAS, Our state and our nation are fortunate to have young 18 men and women whose love for their country inspires them to military 19 service, yet the tragic death of this exemplary young man is a 20 sobering reminder of the cost of war; Americans owe a profound debt 21 to our nation's servicemen and women, whose valiant efforts and 22 enormous sacrifices are deserving of their fellow citizens' deepest 23 respect and gratitude; and
