Monsignor Murphy graduated from Cathedral Seminary High School in

Brooklyn before completing his college course work at St. Mary's

8 Seminary in Kentucky and his theological studies at the Pontifical

College Josephinum in Columbus, Ohio; following his ordination to

the Catholic priesthood on May 26, 1962, Monsignor Murphy earned a

licentiate degree from The Catholic University of America in

12 Washington, D.C., where he studied canon law; and

WHEREAS, Monsignor Murphy ably served the religious community in a host of positions throughout his illustrious tenure with the church; pastor at Holy Angels Church in San Angelo, Holy Family Church in Abilene, and, most recently, St. Ann Church in Midland, he also served as judicial vicar of the Diocese of San Angelo since 1967, chancellor of the diocese from 1970 to 1980, and vicar general of the diocese from 1980 until his passing; in addition to overseeing the construction of new churches and an office building, Monsignor Murphy demonstrated commendable leadership as a diocesan consultor, as a superintendent of schools, and as a member of the Presbyteral Council, the Priests' Personnel Board, the Priests' Pension Plan, and the Diocesan Finance Council;
