RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The city of Odessa and the State of Texas lost a
dedicated and respected public servant with the death of Judge Paul
McCollum on March 30, 2004, at the age of 79; and

WHEREAS, Born in Comanche on March 13, 1925, Paul McCollum 4 5 moved with his family to Odessa in 1940 at the beginning of his junior year in high school; after graduating from Odessa High 6 School in 1942, he attended college for one semester before being 7 sworn in the U.S. Army Air Corps as an aviation cadet; he became the 8 youngest bombardier cadet ever to be graduated and commissioned 9 when he was awarded his wings and a 2nd Lieutenant commission at the 10 11 age of 18; and

12 WHEREAS, A true hero of World War II, Judge McCollum and his 13 crew were shot down over Romania and interned by Turkey before 14 escaping and making their way to Egypt; for his outstanding service to his country, he was awarded two air medals, the European Theater 15 16 of Operations medal with three battle stars, the Mediterranean-North African Theater of Operations medal with one 17 18 battle star, and the North American Theater of Operations medal; and 19

20 WHEREAS, After the war ended, Judge McCollum attended Baylor 21 University, where he graduated with a J.D. degree in 1950; after 22 practicing law for three years in Odessa, he served Ector County as 23 county judge for two years and district judge for five years; in 24 1961, he resigned from the district court bench to practice law with

Shafer, Davis, McCollum, Ashley, O'Leary & Stoker for the next 32 years; in 1994, he was appointed justice for the Eighth Court of Appeals and from 1995 until the time of his death, he served as former and senior justice of that court; and

5 WHEREAS, Judge McCollum was admitted to practice before all 6 courts of Texas, the U.S. district courts, the U.S. courts of appeal 7 for the fifth and eleventh circuits, and the U.S. Supreme Court; 8 throughout his professional career, he served on and chaired 9 committees of the State Bar of Texas, including the prestigious State Bar Conference of Lawyers and Claims Adjusters; he also 10 served four terms as director of and as vice president of the Texas 11 Young Lawyers Association and was one of 300 conferees invited to 12 participate in the World Law Institute in 1997, hosted by President 13 14 Jimmy Carter and President Mikhail Gorbachev; and

15 WHEREAS, In addition to his exceptional career in private practice and public service, Judge McCollum also found the time to 16 17 take part in innumerable community organizations, serving as president of the Odessa Town Hall Association, director of the 18 Odessa Boys Club, president of the Odessa Naturalist Society, 19 director of the Odessa Crystal Ball Foundation, and a founding 20 21 member of The University of Texas of the Permian Basin; other affiliations included the Odessa Chamber of Commerce, the Odessa 22 Rotary Club, the Odessa Masonic Lodge No. 955, and the Odessa Park 23 24 Advisory Board; and

25 WHEREAS, A devoted family man, a lover of the law, and a 26 delightful raconteur, Judge McCollum lived a life of great service 27 to his country, to his community, and to the State of Texas;
