RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, For exceptional achievement in the field 2 aviation, John C. "Red" Morgan is being inducted into the 3 Distinguished Flying Corps Hall of Fame by the Texas Aviation Historical Society on May 31, 2004; and 4 5 WHEREAS, In spite of Mr. Morgan's strapping six-foot, 6 two-inch frame and 210 pounds, his pre-World War II draft board in Texas rejected him for service because of an earlier accident in 7 which he had broken his neck; undaunted by the board's assessment, 8 Mr. Morgan joined the Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) in mid-1940 9 and later, as a member of the RCAF, flew bombers for the Royal Air 10 Force of the United Kingdom; in May 1943, he transferred to the U.S. 11 12 Army Air Forces as a flight officer and was assigned to the 326th Squadron, 92nd Bomb Group, based at Alconbury, England; and 13 14 WHEREAS, On July 18, 1943, Second Lieutenant Morgan assumed copilot duties on a B-17 bomber that lifted off as part of a large 15 formation bound for Hanover, Germany; before reaching the Dutch 16 coast, the formation was intercepted by Luftwaffe fighters and 17 18 Lieutenant Morgan's plane was shelled; the German fire took out the plane's intercom, rendered the tail, waist, and ball-turret gunners 19 unconscious, and caught the pilot, First Lieutenant Robert 20 21 Campbell, in the head; and 22 WHEREAS, Mortally injured, the burly pilot fell forward, locking his arms around the control column; Lieutenant Morgan had 23

to wrest away control of the aircraft quickly, for the Luftwaffe

- 1 would have had an easy target in any plane that fell out of
- 2 formation; rather than remove the pilot's oxygen mask, an act that
- 3 would have proved fatal at that altitude, Lieutenant Morgan managed
- 4 to pull the pilot off the column with one arm while he maneuvered
- 5 the plane back into formation with his other; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Lieutenant Morgan continued to keep his plane in
- 7 formation for the next two hours, all the while fighting to restrain
- 8 the irrational pilot, who fought desperately to regain the
- 9 controls; during that period the B-17 was shelled again and the top
- 10 turret gunner severely wounded; Lieutenant Morgan received
- 11 assistance only after the formation reached its target, when the
- 12 navigator was at last able to go to the cockpit to investigate the
- 13 cause of the plane's erratic flight; and
- WHEREAS, For his heroic action on that day, Lieutenant Morgan
- 15 received the Medal of Honor, this nation's highest decoration for
- 16 valor; he volunteered for several more missions and was
- 17 subsequently shot down during the first raid on Berlin, on March 6,
- 18 1944; and
- WHEREAS, After spending 14 months as a POW, Lieutenant Morgan
- 20 regained his freedom at the end of the war in Europe; he was
- 21 recalled to the service during the Korean War and retired
- completely from the military in 1954; and
- WHEREAS, In addition to the Medal of Honor, this courageous
- 24 pilot was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Medal
- 25 with one oak leaf cluster; and
- WHEREAS, John Morgan joined Texaco in 1938 and returned to
- the company each time he was released from military duty; he retired

- 1 as division manager of the International Aviation Sales Department
- 2 after 39 years' service with the corporation; Mr. Morgan died in
- 3 Nebraska in 1991 and is buried in Arlington National Cemetery; and
- WHEREAS, It is altogether fitting that Mr. Morgan be
- 5 recognized for his extraordinary accomplishment in completing his
- 6 mission and bringing his crew back safely on that brutal July day
- 7 and that a chronicle of his valor be preserved at the English Field
- 8 Air & Space Museum for this and future generations; now, therefore,
- 9 be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas
- 11 Legislature, 4th Called Session, hereby pay special tribute to the
- 12 memory of John C. "Red" Morgan on the occasion of his induction into
- 13 the Distinguished Flying Corps Hall of Fame by the Texas Aviation
- 14 Historical Society; and, be it further
- 15 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
- 16 prepared for Mr. Morgan's family as an expression of high regard by
- 17 the Texas House of Representatives.
