R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Mamawa M. Moore truly merits special recognition for
2 her years of outstanding service as a teacher; and

3 WHEREAS, Currently on the faculty of Our Mother of Mercy
4 Catholic School in Houston, Ms. Moore has previously taught at
5 Deady Middle School and Forest Brook High School, also in Houston;
6 prior to her arrival in Texas, she taught at Grahamwood Elementary
7 School in Memphis, Tennessee, and Barnes Foundation School in
8 Monrovia, Liberia; and

9 WHEREAS, A recipient of a Fulbright scholarship in 1989, Ms.
10 Moore received her bachelor's degree in elementary education at the
11 Teachers College of the University of Liberia, where she received
12 an Academic Achievement Award, and her master's degree in social
13 studies education at the Teachers College of Columbia University in
14 New York; after completing her studies at Columbia, a civil war in
15 Liberia prevented Ms. Moore from returning to her homeland; through
16 the Fulbright Commission, she was granted protective status to
17 remain in the United States and the opportunity to bring her husband
18 and children to join her in America; and

19 WHEREAS, In her tenure at Our Mother of Mercy, this exemplary
20 educator has earned the respect and the admiration of her students
21 and her colleagues, and her passion for teaching has enriched the
22 lives of many; now, therefore, be it

23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 78th Texas
24 Legislature, 4th Called Session, hereby commend Mamawa M. Moore for

1 her dedicated service to the students of Our Mother of Mercy
2 Catholic School in Houston and extend to her sincere best wishes for
