WHEREAS, Mr. Brooks's strong social conscience led him to participate in the numerous sit-ins that ultimately resulted in the integration of the Foley's lunch counter in Houston; in addition, he took part in the historic March on Washington in 1963; and

WHEREAS, A talented attorney who lived through a turbulent era of American history, Mr. Brooks retired to Oakland, California, after an exemplary 30-year career with the federal government in New York City; his efforts in support of civil rights made him a source of tremendous pride for everyone in the Fifth Ward, and his memory will not soon be forgotten; now, therefore, be it
