## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, After winning the Academic Decathlon state 2 competition for the 12th consecutive year in February 2004, the 3 Friendswood High School Academic Decathlon team progressed to the 4 April national competition in Boise, Idaho, where it placed fifth 5 in its division and seventh among all 42 teams participating from 6 around the country; and

WHEREAS, The most prestigious high school academic team 7 competition in the United States, the Academic Decathlon was 8 founded on the precept that everyone's learning potential can be 9 maximized through competitive challenge; like the athletic 10 contest, the Academic Decathlon does not permit participants to 11 12 specialize but rather requires students to prepare for all 10 scholastic events, which include art, economics, essay, interview, 13 14 language and literature, mathematics, music, science, social science, and speech; a program designed to include and encourage 15 all students, the decathlon calls for each competing high school to 16 enter a team of nine, consisting of three "A" or honor students, 17 three "B" or scholastic students, and three "C" or varsity 18 students; and 19

20 WHEREAS, Seven of the nine Friendswood High students who 21 competed nationally placed in the top three in at least one 22 category; the only holdover from last year's state champion team, 23 Andy Steinhauser, placed first in science, third in art, and third 24 in super quiz; the highest scoring student from Texas in the event,

Mr. Steinhauser received a \$500 scholarship for his efforts; and 1 2 WHEREAS, Robert Lockwood placed first in language and 3 literature and third in science and super quiz while Micah Fessler garnered second-place honors in science and super quiz; Wil Ramsey 4 5 placed first in speech, Chris Smith placed second in math, and Trey 6 German placed second in economics while Alex Hoeg finished in third 7 place in economics; rounding out the outstanding team are Ryan 8 Rahman, David Sanders, and manager Allen Miller; and

9 WHEREAS, Under the capable leadership of coaches Mary 10 Rinehart and Renae Simons, these exemplary young students have once 11 again brought well-deserved recognition to their school and their 12 community, and it is a pleasure to commend the team for its 13 long-standing tradition of academic excellence; now, therefore, be 14 it
