A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to national certification of certain public school
- 3 teachers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS. (a) The legislature
- 6 finds that if Texas is to have world-class schools, then Texas must
- 7 first have a world-class teaching force.
- 8 (b) The legislature also finds that certification by the
- 9 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, developed by
- 10 teachers for teachers:
- 11 (1) is a symbol of and tool for professional teaching
- 12 excellence;
- 13 (2) establishes advanced standards for an experienced
- 14 teacher by testing the teacher's knowledge against standards of
- other highly trained teachers throughout the country; and
- 16 (3) ensures that teachers meet high professional
- 17 standards of commitment and competence.
- 18 (c) The legislature also finds that an independent,
- 19 multi-year study of more than 600,000 students in North Carolina
- 20 found that the students of teachers who were nationally certified
- 21 experienced an increase in reading and math assessment instrument
- 22 scores by an average of seven percent.
- 23 (d) The legislature also finds that of the approximately
- 24 289,000 teachers in Texas, only 144 of those teachers are

- 1 nationally certified, compared with 4,938 nationally certified
- 2 teachers in Florida and 2,644 nationally certified teachers in
- 3 California.
- 4 (e) The legislature also finds that in order for Texas
- 5 students to compete with students from other states, as Texas moves
- 6 toward a knowledge-based economy, Texas must encourage teachers to
- 7 pursue national certification. The 21st Century Educational
- 8 Excellence Program for National Certification serves that goal by
- 9 establishing a statewide program to assist Texas teachers in
- 10 achieving national certification.
- 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 21, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 12 Subchapter N to read as follows:
- 13 <u>SUBCHAP</u>TER N. 21ST CENTURY EDUCATIONAL EXCELLENCE PROGRAM
- 14 FOR NATIONAL CERTIFICATION
- Sec. 21.651. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 16 (1) "Board" means the National Board for Professional
- 17 Teaching Standards.
- 18 <u>(2) "Program" means the</u> 21st Century Educational
- 19 Excellence Program for National Certification.
- Sec. 21.652. ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM. The agency shall
- 21 <u>establish the 21st Century Educational Excellence Program for</u>
- 22 National Certification to encourage teachers in critical subject
- 23 areas to obtain national certification by the board.
- Sec. 21.653. ELIGIBILITY. (a) A teacher employed by a
- 25 school district is eligible for participation in the program if the
- teacher is certified by the State Board for Educator Certification
- 27 in bilingual education, mathematics, science, special education,

- 1 elementary reading, or another teaching field identified by the
- 2 commissioner as experiencing a critical shortage of teachers in
- 3 this state in the year in which the teacher applies to participate
- 4 <u>in the program.</u>
- 5 (b) A teacher employed by an open-enrollment charter school
- 6 is not eligible for participation in the program.
- 7 Sec. 21.654. APPLICATION; SELECTION OF APPLICANTS. (a)
- 8 The agency shall select not more than 500 eligible teachers to
- 9 participate in the program each year.
- 10 (b) The agency shall adopt:
- 11 (1) procedures for submitting an application to
- 12 participate in the program; and
- 13 (2) criteria for the selection of teachers to
- 14 participate in the program.
- Sec. 21.655. PAYMENT OF CERTIFICATION COSTS. (a) A teacher
- 16 who participates in the program is entitled to receive an amount
- 17 equal to the certification fee charged by the board.
- (b) From funds appropriated for the purpose, the agency
- 19 shall pay the teacher an amount equal to two-thirds of the cost of
- 20 certification. The school district that employs the teacher shall
- 21 pay the remaining one-third of the cost of certification.
- (c) A teacher who does not complete all of the requirements
- for assessment by the board shall reimburse the agency and school
- 24 district the full amount of the payments received under Subsection
- 25 (b). This subsection does not apply to a teacher who completes all
- of the requirements for assessment by the board but who is not
- 27 certified by the board.

- Sec. 21.656. STIPEND. A school district may pay a teacher
- 2 who participates in the program and obtains board certification a
- 3 stipend. From funds appropriated for the purpose, the agency may
- 4 match the amount the district pays the teacher in an amount not
- 5 greater than \$2,000.
- 6 Sec. 21.657. STAFF DEVELOPMENT PLAN. The agency shall
- 7 establish a statewide staff development plan that uses the skills
- 8 and knowledge of teachers who have obtained board certification.
- 9 <u>Sec. 21.658.</u> RULES. The commissioner shall adopt rules as
- 10 necessary to implement this subchapter.
- 11 SECTION 3. The Texas Education Agency and the commissioner
- 12 of education shall implement the 21st Century Educational
- 13 Excellence Program for National Certification, as required by
- 14 Subchapter N, Chapter 21, Education Code, as added by this Act, as
- 15 soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 21 legislative session.
