## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to tuition exemptions granted by public institutions of
3	higher education to children of certain classroom teachers.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 54.220 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 54.220. CHILDREN OF CLASSROOM TEACHERS. (a) The
8	governing board of each institution of higher education shall
9	exempt a person who is a resident of this state and a child of an
10	eligible classroom teacher from the payment of tuition when the
11	child is enrolled as an undergraduate student at the institution.
12	(b) To be eligible for an exemption from the payment of
13	tuition, a person must be a child of a person who at the beginning of
14	the semester or other equivalent academic session for which are
15	exemption is sought holds a National Board Certification, as
16	defined by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards,
17	and has 10 or more years of experience as a classroom teacher in a
18	critical teaching shortage field in one or more school districts in
19	this state, not including experience as a teaching aide or
20	administrator, and:

state to work as a classroom teacher in a critical teaching shortage

classroom teacher in a critical teaching shortage field; or

(1) is employed by a school district in this state as a

(2) has contracted with a school district in this

- 2 child is enrolled for a summer term or other academic session, has
- 3 contracted with a school district in this state to work as a
- 4 classroom teacher in a critical teaching shortage field during the
- 5 <u>next school year.</u>
- 6 (c) A person is not eligible for an exemption under this
- 7 section if the person:
- 8 <u>(1) has previously received an exemption under this</u>
- 9 <u>section for 10 semesters or other equivalent academic sessions at</u>
- 10 any institution or institutions of higher education; or
- 11 (2) has received a baccalaureate degree.
- (d) For purposes of Subsection (c), a summer term or other
- 13 academic session that is less than nine weeks in duration is
- 14 considered one-half of a regular semester or equivalent academic
- 15 session.
- 16 (e) A person attending an institution of higher education
- 17 who becomes eligible to receive an exemption from tuition under
- 18 Subsection (b) is eligible for a refund of the amount of money that
- 19 the person paid to any institution of higher education for tuition
- 20 as a resident student in the three-year period preceding the
- 21 beginning of the first semester or session for which the person
- 22 <u>receives the exemption.</u>
- 23 (f) To receive a refund under Subsection (e), the person
- 24 must apply to the institution from which the refund is sought before
- 25 the expiration of one year after the person becomes eligible for the
- 26 refund. The institution shall pay the refund from any available
- 27 funds of the institution.

- 1 (g) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 2 adopt:
- 3 (1) rules governing the granting or denial of an
- 4 exemption under this section, including rules relating to the
- 5 determination of eligibility for an exemption or for a refund of
- 6 previously paid tuition; and
- 7 (2) a uniform application form for an exemption under
- 8 this section.
- 9 (h) In the funding formulas established under Section
- 10 61.059 for a biennium, the coordinating board shall take into
- 11 account any tuition exempted or any refund of tuition made in the
- 12 preceding biennium under this section.
- 13 <u>(i) In this section:</u>
- 14 (1) "Child" means a child of any age, including an
- 15 adult child. The term includes an adopted child.
- 16 (2) "Classroom teacher" has the meaning assigned by
- 17 Section 5.001(2).
- 18 (3) "Critical teaching shortage field" means an
- 19 instructional field designated by the commissioner of education as
- 20 experiencing a critical shortage of teachers.
- 21 SECTION 2. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), this
- 22 Act takes effect beginning with the 2005 fall semester.
- 23 (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 24 adopt rules and forms relating to the exemption of the children of
- 25 classroom teachers under Section 54.220, Education Code, as added
- 26 by this Act, not later than January 1, 2005.
- 27 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2004.
