## **BILL ANALYSIS**

H.B. 1570 By: Gallego Public Education Committee Report (Unamended)

## **BACKGROUND**

Currently, it is against University Interscholastic League (UIL) rules for a community or public organization in the community to hold any type of celebration honoring the achievements of a team representing a school or a school district in a league activity.

## **PURPOSE**

House Bill 1570 prohibits the UIL from penalizing a team for participating in a community celebration, including a dinner or party, being held in the team's honor.

## **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

It is the committee's opinion that this bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, department, agency, or institution.

# **ANALYSIS**

House Bill 1570 amends the Education Code to prohibit the University Interscholastic League (UIL) from penalizing a team representing a school or school district in a league activity for participating in a community organized celebration held by the community or a public organization in the community in which the school or school district is located.

## **EFFECTIVE DATE**

Upon Passage, or, if the Act does not receive the necessary vote, the Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
