DIGEST AND PURPOSE

Currently, there is no statutory authority for a member serving on a metropolitan planning organization to appoint a proxy to act in the member's absence on matters before the policy board. H.B. 1883 authorizes a policy board of a metropolitan planning organization to provide for appointing voting proxies by its members, and establishes related requirements.

RULEMAKING AUTHORITY

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS

SECTION 1. Amends Chapter 472, Transportation Code, by adding Subchapter D, as follows:

SUBCHAPTER D. METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATIONS

Sec. 472.031. POLICY BOARD. (a) Authorizes a policy board of a metropolitan planning organization, designated or redesignated under 23 U.S.C. Section 134, to provide in its bylaws for appointment of voting proxies by its members.

- (b) Sets forth requirements regarding the appointed proxy.
- (c) Provides that this section applies only to a policy board with at least 22 voting members of a metropolitan planning organization designated or redesignated for an urbanized area that meets certain criteria.

SECTION 2. Effective date: upon passage or September 1, 2003.
