## **BILL ANALYSIS**

H.B. 1883 By: Baxter Transportation Committee Report (Unamended)

# BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

Currently there is no statutory authority for members serving on a metropolitan planning organization to appoint a voting proxy to act in their absence on matters before the policy board. H.B. 1883 authorizes a policy board of a metropolitan planning organization designated or redesignated under 23 U.S.C. Section 134 to provide in its bylaws for appointment of voting proxies by its members.

### **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

It is the committee's opinion that this bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, department, agency, or institution.

# ANALYSIS

HB 1883 amends Chapter 472, Transportation Code, by adding Subchapter D, to authorize a policyboard of a metropolitan planning organization designated or redesignated under 23 U.S.C. Section 134 to provide in its bylaws for appointment of voting proxies by its members. A proxy appointed under Subsection (a): acts on behalf of and under the supervision of the policy board member who appointed the proxy; must be appointed in writing; and is authorized to vote for the policy board member who appointed the proxy to the extent the member has given the proxy the member's voting power.

# EFFECTIVE DATE

Upon passage, or if the Act does not receive the necessary vote, the Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
