DIGEST AND PURPOSE

Currently, Texas faces a difficult challenge to develop water policies that serve state and regional interests. The Texas Constitution authorizes the creation of groundwater conservation districts to plan, develop, and regulate the use of water. H.B. 3374 creates the Kenedy Groundwater Conservation District, subject to approval at a confirmation election, to manage groundwater resources in Kenedy County.

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.
