## **DIGEST AND PURPOSE**

Current Texas law does not address the need for educating individuals regarding anatomical gifts. S.B. 160 requires the Texas Department of Health to develop a program to educate health care providers and attorneys on human organ donation and encourages medical and nursing schools to include organ donation education classes in their curriculum.

## **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

This bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, institution, or agency.

## **SECTION BY SECTION ANALYSIS**

SECTION 1. Amends Chapter 49, Health and Safety Code, by adding Section 49.002, as follows:

Section 49.002. EDUCATION FOR HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS AND ATTORNEYS.

- (a) Requires the Texas Department of Health (TDH) to develop an educational program regarding anatomical gifts for health care providers and attorneys in Texas.
  - (b) Requires TDH through the program to encourage attorneys to provide to individuals seeking legal counsel for end-of-life decisions organ donation information.
  - (c) Requires TDH to encourage medical and nursing schools in Texas to include mandatory organ donation education in their curricula.
  - (d) Requires TDH to encourage medical schools in Texas to require a physician in either a neurology or neurosurgery residency program to complete an advanced course in organ donation education.
  - (e) Requires TDH to implement the program only to the extent that certain factors are met.

SECTION 2. Effective date: September 1, 2003.
