S.B. 1745 By: Zaffirini Criminal Jurisprudence Committee Report (Unamended)

# **BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE**

Currently, law enforcement agencies are not required to request an immediate forensic exam for victims who report an assault within a certain time of its occurrence. Senate Bill 1745 provides that a victim of an alleged sexual assault is entitled to a forensic medical examination if the alleged sexual assault was reported within 96 hours of its occurrence.

## **RULEMAKING AUTHORITY**

It is the committee's opinion that this bill does not expressly grant any additional rulemaking authority to a state officer, department, agency, or institution.

## **ANALYSIS**

Senate Bill 1745 amends the Code of Criminal Procedure to entitle a victim of sexual assault the right to a forensic medical examination, if the victim reported the sexual assault to a law enforcement agency within 96 hours of the assault.
