4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 614, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 614.055 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 614.055. PURCHASE OF BADGE, INSIGNIA, WEAPON, OR
8	UNIFORM OF CERTAIN HONORABLY RETIRED OR DECEASED PEACE OFFICERS OR
9	FIRE FIGHTERS. (a) An individual may purchase a badge, insignia,
10	weapon, or uniform from a state or local governmental agency as
11	provided by this section if:
12	(1) the individual was commissioned or employed by the
13	agency as a:
14	(A) peace officer;
15	(B) fire fighter;
16	(C) licensed paramedic;
17	(D) certified emergency medical technician; or
18	(E) fire or emergency medical services
19	dispatcher;
20	(2) the individual:
21	(A) was honorably retired from the individual's
22	commission or employment by the agency; or
23	(B) is scheduled to retire honorably not later
24	than 90 days after the date of purchase from the individual's

- 2 (3) the badge, insignia, weapon, or uniform had been
- 3 previously issued to the individual by the agency.
- 4 (b) The nearest surviving relative of an individual
- 5 described by Subsection (a)(1) who died or was permanently disabled
- 6 in the line of duty under honorable circumstances as determined by
- 7 the agency may purchase items described by Subsection (a)(3).
- 8 (c) An individual or person may not purchase a weapon
- 9 prohibited under Section 46.05, Penal Code.
- 10 (d) Another person such as an association of peace officers
- or fire fighters may purchase a badge, insignia, weapon, or uniform
- 12 to present to an individual who meets the qualifications of
- 13 Subsection (a) or to the nearest surviving relative described by
- 14 Subsection (b).
- (e) An individual or person who purchases a badge, insignia,
- 16 weapon, or uniform under this section must:
- 17 (1) purchase the badge, insignia, weapon, or uniform
- 18 at fair market value; and
- 19 (2) permanently affix on a plaque or place in a
- 20 presentation case the badge, insignia, weapon, or uniform.
- 21 (f) This section does not apply to the extent that an item
- 22 may be purchased by or on behalf of an individual under other law.
- SECTION 2. The heading to Subchapter D, Chapter 614,
- 24 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 25 SUBCHAPTER D. PURCHASE OF AGENCY-ISSUED ITEMS [FIREARM] OF
- 26 HONORABLY RETIRED OR DECEASED PEACE OFFICER OR FIRE FIGHTER
- SECTION 3. Section 614.053, Government Code, is amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 614.053. PURCHASE PRICE OF FIREARM. A state or local
- 3 governmental agency shall establish the amount, which may not
- 4 exceed fair market value, for which a firearm or other item may be
- 5 purchased under this subchapter.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
