- SECTION 1. Section 572.052(a), Government Code, is amended 5

- A member of the legislature may not, for compensation, 7
- represent another person before a state agency in the executive 8
- branch of state government [unless: 9
- [(1) the representation: 10
- [(A) is made in a proceeding that is adversary in 11
- 12 nature or in another public hearing that is a matter of record; or
- [(B) involves the filing of documents, contacts 13
- 14 with the agency, or other relations, that involve only ministerial
- acts on the part of the commission, agency, board, department, or 15
- officer; and 16
- [(2) the member discloses to the agency that the 17
- member is being compensated for the representation]. 18
- SECTION 2. Section 572.021, Government Code, is amended to 19
- read as follows: 20
- 21 Sec. 572.021. FINANCIAL STATEMENT REQUIRED. A
- 22 officer, a partisan or independent candidate for an office as an
- elected officer, and a party chairman shall file with the 23
- commission a verified financial statement complying with Sections 24

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- 1 572.022 through 572.024 [572.025].
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 572.025, Government Code, is repealed.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act applies only to representation before
- 4 an executive state agency for which a member of the legislature is
- 5 hired on or after September 1, 2003. Representation for which a
- 6 member of the legislature was hired before September 1, 2003, and
- 7 the reporting of that registration are governed by the law in effect
- 8 at the time the member was hired, and that law is continued in
- 9 effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
