7	Sec. 302.010. PRIORITY STATUS FOR CERTAIN VETERANS. (a) In
8	accepting an applicant for job training and employment services,
9	the commission and any other provider of services shall grant
10	priority for admission to the services to a veteran who satisfies
11	the requirements of this section.
12	(b) To receive priority under this section, the veteran must
13	meet the eligibility criteria and qualifications for the specific

meet the eligibility criteria and qualifications for the specific program and apply to the commission or services provider, as appropriate, for priority status. The application must include information or be accompanied by documentation that satisfies the commission or provider that the applying veteran served:

- (1) on active duty and was discharged or released from

 19 active duty with an honorable discharge or because of an

- 21 (2) as a member of a reserve component on active duty
 22 during a war or in a campaign or expedition for which a campaign

- 1 (c) The commission shall adopt rules and prescribe forms as
 2 necessary to administer this section.
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
