A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the payment of certain costs incurred in the 3 investigation of criminal or injurious conduct. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 Article 56.06, Code of Criminal Procedure, is 5 SECTION 1. amended to read as follows: 6 7 Art. 56.06. COSTS OF CERTAIN INVESTIGATORY EXAMINATIONS 8 [MEDICAL EXAMINATION]. (a) A law enforcement agency that requests a medical, dental, or mental health examination of a victim of an 9 alleged felony offense under Title 5 or Title 6, Penal Code, [sexual 10 assault] for use in the investigation or prosecution of the offense 11 12 shall pay all costs of the examination. A law enforcement agency or 13 prosecuting attorney's office may pay all costs related to the 14 testimony of a licensed health care professional in a criminal proceeding regarding the results of the medical, dental, or mental 15 health examination or the manner in which it was performed. 16 (b) This article does not require a law enforcement agency 17 to pay any costs of treatment for injuries. 18 Sections 261.302(a) and (c), Family Code, are SECTION 2. 19 amended to read as follows: 20 21 (a) The investigation may include: 22 (1) a visit to the child's home, unless the alleged abuse or neglect can be confirmed or clearly ruled out without a 23 24 home visit; and

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(2) an interview with and examination of the subject
 child, which may include a medical, <u>dental</u>, psychological, or
 psychiatric examination.

4 (c) The investigation may include an interview with the
5 child's parents and an interview with and medical, <u>dental</u>,
6 psychological, or psychiatric examination of any child in the home.
7 SECTION 3. Subchapter D, Chapter 261, Family Code, is
8 amended by adding Section 261.313 to read as follows:

9 <u>Sec. 261.313. COSTS OF CERTAIN INVESTIGATORY EXAMINATIONS.</u> 10 <u>If the department or designated agency or a designee of the</u> 11 <u>department or agency conducts a medical, dental, psychological, or</u> 12 <u>psychiatric examination of a child under Section 261.302, the</u> 13 <u>department or agency shall pay all costs of the examination.</u>

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and applies only to a medical, dental, or mental health examination conducted on or after that date.

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
