## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 481.0065, Government Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 481.0065. OFFICE OF DEFENSE AFFAIRS. (a) The 8 department shall:
- 9 (1) establish and maintain an Office of Defense 10 Affairs; and
- 11 (2) appoint a director to manage the Office of Defense 12 Affairs.
- 13 (b) The Office of Defense Affairs shall:
- (1) provide information to defense-dependent communities, the legislature, the Texas congressional delegation, and state agencies regarding federal actions affecting military
- 17 installations and missions;
- 18 (2) serve as a clearinghouse for:
- 19 (A) defense economic adjustment and transition
- 20 information and activities [along with the Texas Business and
- 21 Community Economic Development Clearinghouse]; and
- 22 (B) information about:
- 23 (i) issues related to the operating costs
- 24 and strategic value of federal military installations located in

- 1 the state; [and]
- 2 (ii) the loss of jobs in defense-dependent
- 3 communities and defense-related businesses; and
- 4 (iii) interstate competition relative to
- 5 defense strategies and incentive programs that other states are
- 6 utilizing to maintain, expand, and attract new defense contractors;
- 7 (3) provide assistance to defense-dependent
- 8 communities that have experienced a defense-related closure or
- 9 realignment, including the administration and oversight for
- 10 implementing the programs established under Chapter 486,
- 11 Government Code, and Chapter 2310, Government Code;
- 12 (4) assist defense-dependent communities in the
- 13 design and execution of programs that enhance a community's
- 14 relationship with military installations and defense-related
- 15 businesses; [and]
- 16 (5) assist communities in the retention, expansion,
- and recruiting of defense-related businesses; and
- 18 (6) assist with the development of state strategies
- and programs to protect the state's existing military missions and
- 20 position Texas to be competitive for new or expanded military
- 21 missions; and
- 22 (7) serve as the state's focal point for the
- 23 coordination of all issues and policies that would affect active,
- 24 closed, or realigned military installations and defense-related
- 25 business.
- 26 (c) The Office of Defense Affairs shall prepare an annual
- 27 report about the active military installations, defense-dependent

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- 1 communities, and defense-related businesses in this state. The
- 2 report must include:
- 3 (1) an economic impact statement describing in detail
- 4 the effect of the military on the economy of this state;
- 5 (2) a statewide assessment of active military
- 6 installations and current missions;
- 7 (3) a statewide strategy to attract defense-related
- 8 business and prevent future defense closures and realignments;
- 9 (4) a list of state and federal activities that have
- 10 significant impact on active military installations and current
- 11 missions;
- 12 (5) a statement identifying:
- 13 (A) the state and federal programs and services
- 14 that assist defense-dependent communities impacted by military
- 15 base closures or realignments and the efforts to coordinate those
- 16 programs; and
- 17 (B) the efforts to coordinate state agency
- 18 programs and services that assist defense-dependent communities in
- 19 retaining active military installations and current missions;
- 20 (6) an evaluation of initiatives to retain existing
- 21 defense-related businesses; and
- 22 (7) a list of agencies with regulations, policies,
- 23 programs, or services that impact the operating costs or strategic
- 24 value of federal military installations and activities in the
- 25 state.
- 26 (d) State agencies shall cooperate with and assist the
- 27 Office of Defense Affairs in the preparation of the report required

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- 1 under Subsection (c) including providing information about
- 2 regulations, policies, programs, and services that may impact
- 3 defense-dependent communities, defense-related businesses, and the
- 4 viability of existing Texas military missions. The Office of
- 5 Defense Affairs shall submit its report to the governor and the
- 6 legislature not later than July 1 of each year.
- 7 (e) The Office of Defense Affairs shall coordinate an annual
- 8 meeting with the head of each state agency, members of the Texas
- 9 Strategic Military Planning Commission, and members of the
- 10 legislature whose districts contain active, closed, or realigned
- 11 military installations to discuss the implementation of the
- 12 recommendations outlined in the report required under Subsection
- 13 (c).
- (f)  $[\frac{d}{d}]$  The Office of Defense Affairs shall develop and
- 15 maintain a database of the names and public business information of
- 16 all prime contractors and subcontractors operating in this state
- 17 who perform defense-related work.
- 18 [(f) The Office of Defense Affairs may enter into an
- 19 agreement with a consulting firm to provide information and
- 20 assistance on a pending decision of the United States Department of
- 21 Defense or other federal agency regarding the status of military
- 22 installations and defense-related businesses located in this
- 23 state.
- 24 (g) In this section, "state agency" has the meaning assigned
- 25 by Section 2151.002.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
