- 2 relating to the automatic admission of certain undergraduate 3 transfer students.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 51.801, Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 51.801. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter, "general
- 8 academic teaching institution," "governing board," "medical and
- 9 dental unit," "public junior college," "public technical
- 10 <u>institute,"</u> and "university system" have the meanings assigned by
- 11 Section 61.003.

- 12 SECTION 2. Subchapter U, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 51.8065 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 51.8065. AUTOMATIC ADMISSION: UNDERGRADUATE TRANSFER
- 15 STUDENTS. (a) Each general academic teaching institution shall
- 16 admit an applicant for admission to the institution as an
- 17 undergraduate transfer student if in the year preceding the
- 18 academic year for which the applicant is applying for admission
- 19 under this section the applicant:
- 20 <u>(1) received a degree or certificate from a public</u>
- 21 junior college or public technical institute in a program requiring
- 22 <u>at least 30 semester credit hours, including the courses required</u>
- in the core curriculum established under Section 61.822; and
- (2) completed the program with a cumulative grade

- 1 point average of at least a 3.0 on a four-point scale or the
- 2 equivalent.
- 3 (b) To qualify for admission under this section, an
- 4 applicant must submit an application before the expiration of any
- 5 application filing deadline established by the institution.
- 6 (c) After admitting an applicant under this section, the
- 7 <u>institution may review the applicant's record and any other factor</u>
- 8 the institution considers appropriate to determine whether the
- 9 applicant may require additional preparation for college-level
- 10 work or would benefit from inclusion in a retention program. The
- 11 institution may require a student so identified to enroll during
- 12 the summer immediately after the student is admitted under this
- 13 section to participate in appropriate enrichment courses and
- orientation programs. This section does not prohibit a student who
- is not determined to need additional preparation for college-level
- 16 work from enrolling, if the student chooses, during the summer
- immediately after the student is admitted under this section.
- 18 (d) Admission to a specific institution is contingent upon
- 19 the institution having space available for admission of additional
- 20 students.
- (e) An institution may have requirements for admission to a
- 22 particular program or school that exceed a 3.0 average. Admissions
- 23 to a particular program or school within an institution shall be
- 24 based on the requirements of the institution.
- 25 SECTION 3. (a) This Act takes effect immediately and
- 26 applies beginning with admissions for the 2004 fall semester.
- 27 (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board and each

- 3 Education Code, as added by this Act, not later than January 1,
- 4 2003.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
