	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to insurance issues regarding the use of mold, fire, and
3	water resistant materials in residential building and repairs.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The Insurance Code is amended by adding Chapter 5A
6	to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 5A. BUILDING CODE SPECIFICATIONS AND MAINTENANCE
8	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
9	Art. 5A.01. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "advisory
10	committee" means the Building Code Advisory Committee on
11	Specifications and Maintenance.
12	Art. 5A.02. RULES. In addition to any other rulemaking
13	authority granted under this article, the commissioner may adopt
14	rules as necessary to implement this chapter.
15	[Articles 5A.03-5A.50 reserved for expansion]
16	SUBCHAPTER B. ADVISORY COMMITTEE
17	Art. 5A.51. ADVISORY COMMITTEE. The Building Code Advisory
18	Committee on Specifications and Maintenance is established as an
19	advisory committee to advise and make recommendations to the
20	commissioner on building specifications and maintenance related to
21	the use of mold, fire, and water resistant materials in residential
22	building and repairs and related insurance issues.
23	Art. 5A.52. COMPOSITION. (a) The advisory committee is
24	composed of nine voting members appointed by the commissioner as

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1	follows:
2	(1) three members from the building industry,
3	including:
4	(A) two residential builders; and
5	(B) one representative from the building supply
6	industry;
7	(2) three members from the insurance industry,
8	including two full-time employees of an insurer authorized to
9	engage in the business of property and casualty insurance in this
10	state; and
11	(3) three public members, including one member who is
12	a professional engineer licensed in this state.
13	(b) The commissioner or the commissioner's designated
14	representative shall serve as an ex officio, nonvoting member of
15	the advisory committee.
16	Art. 5A.53. TERMS. A voting member of the advisory
17	committee serves a three-year term.
18	Art. 5A.54. MEETINGS. (a) The advisory committee shall, at
19	least two times each year, meet at the call of the presiding officer
20	with the approval of the commissioner.
21	(b) The advisory committee shall publish the date and
22	location of the meeting not later than the 45th day before the date
23	on which the meeting is scheduled to occur.
24	(c) The commissioner or the commissioner's designee must be
25	present at each meeting of the advisory committee.

27	SUBCHAPTER C. PROPOSALS AND RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING MOLD,

1	FIRE, AND WATER RESISTANT MATERIALS
2	Art. 5A.101. RECOMMENDATIONS. (a) The advisory committee
3	shall analyze and make recommendations for changes regarding
4	building specifications adopted by the commissioner related to the
5	use of mold, fire, and water resistant materials in residential
6	building and repairs and related insurance issues.
7	(b) In making a recommendation, the advisory committee
8	shall consider technological developments in building products and
9	research and shall seek to balance the concerns of all affected
10	parties, including consumers, builders, and the insurance
11	industry.
12	Art. 5A.102. CONTENT OF PROPOSALS. (a) The commissioner by
13	rule shall adopt a form to be used by a person in presenting a
14	proposal for a change in an applicable building specification to
15	the commissioner.
16	(b) Each proposal for a change in an applicable building
17	specification must be submitted to the commissioner on the form
18	adopted under Subsection (a) of this article and must contain:
19	(1) the name, mailing address, and telephone number of
20	the proponent or, if the proponent is an entity, the name of the
21	entity and the mailing address and telephone number of the entity;
22	(2) a citation of the building code section regarding
23	that specification, as published in the latest edition of that
24	<u>code;</u>
25	(3) the text of the proposed change, with deletions
26	from current code language struck through with a single line and new
27	language underlined; and

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1	(4) a statement of the purpose of the proposed change,
2	with supporting written or printed information.
3	Art. 5A.103. TIMING ON PROPOSALS. (a) Each proposal shall
4	be submitted not later than the 30th day before the date of a
5	scheduled advisory committee meeting.
6	(b) A proposal that does not comply with the requirements
7	adopted under Article 5A.102 of this subchapter and is not
8	submitted within the time specified in this article may not be
9	considered at that scheduled meeting.
10	Art. 5A.104. DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT. (a) The department
11	shall review and organize each proposal submitted and shall allow
12	the advisory committee and any interested party to view the
13	proposal to be considered within a reasonable time before the
14	advisory committee meeting.
15	(b) If requested by a majority of the advisory committee,
16	the department shall make recommendations regarding each proposal
17	submitted and provide to the advisory committee any necessary
18	technical information.
19	Art. 5A.105. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION. (a) At an advisory
20	committee meeting, any interested person may present the person's
21	views on a proposal for a change in an applicable building
22	specification that is included on the advisory committee's
23	published agenda.
24	(b) The advisory committee shall consider each comment
25	presented in its action on the disposition of each proposal.
26	Art. 5A.106. ACTION ON PROPOSAL. (a) After consideration
27	of a proposal for a change in an applicable building specification,

1	the advisory committee by vote shall:
2	(1) recommend adoption of the proposal as initially
3	submitted;
4	(2) recommend adoption of the proposal with
5	<pre>modifications;</pre>
6	(3) recommend rejection of the proposal; or
7	(4) suspend consideration of the proposal and request
8	additional evaluation and study of the proposal.
9	(b) The advisory committee shall submit its recommendation
10	on each proposal to the commissioner.
11	Art. 5A.107. ACTION BY COMMISSIONER ON RECOMMENDATIONS. (a)
12	The commissioner shall notify the advisory committee of the
13	acceptance or rejection of each recommendation not later than the
14	30th day after the date of receipt by the commissioner.
15	(b) Acceptance of a recommendation by the commissioner
16	means that the commissioner will consider adoption of that
17	recommendation at a rulemaking hearing.
18	(c) Before adopting a recommendation, the commissioner must
19	determine that the proposal, if adopted, will not weaken the
20	integrity or diminish the effectiveness of a building
21	specification.
22	(d) The commissioner by rule may adopt a recommendation of
23	the advisory committee.

25	SUBCHAPTER D. PREMIUM DISCOUNTS FOR USE OF MOLD,
26	FIRE, AND WATER RESISTANT MATERIALS
27	Art. 5A.151. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "residential

1	property insurance" means insurance coverage written by an insurer
2	authorized to engage in the business of homeowners insurance, farm
3	and ranch owners insurance, or fire and residential allied lines
4	insurance in this state, including a fire and marine insurer, farm
5	mutual insurer, county mutual insurer, Lloyd's plan, or reciprocal
6	or interinsurance exchange.
7	Art. 5A.152. ESTABLISHMENT OF DISCOUNT. (a) The
8	commissioner by rule may require a premium discount for the use of a
9	mold, fire, or water resistant material recommended to and adopted
10	by the commissioner under Subchapter C of this chapter.
11	(b) The commissioner by rule shall establish the amount of
12	the discount.
13	Art. 5A.153. PREMIUM DISCOUNT. If required under Article
14	5A.152 of this subchapter, an insurer who delivers or issues for
15	delivery a policy of residential property insurance in this state
16	shall grant a premium discount to insure a dwelling that has a
17	correctly installed mold, fire, or water resistant material
18	approved by the commissioner under this chapter.
19	SECTION 2. Not later than September 1, 2003, the
20	commissioner of insurance shall appoint the members of the Building
21	Code Advisory Committee on Specifications and Maintenance created
22	under Subchapter B, Chapter 5A, Insurance Code, as added by this
23	Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

1 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
